## **CURRENT PROCESSES FOR SITE PLAN SUBMITTAL TO FMO**

**Large** site plans or minor site plans, subdivision plans, public improvement plans, rough grading plans, or minor revisions to those types of plans that propose **new** buildings or infrastructures, building additions, greater than 4500 SF of land disturbance, extensive site improvements, parking lot redesigns, etc. must use **standard official Fairfax County LDS SDID application process**.

Plan is then reviewed by SDID and all outside agencies (including FMO) using ProjectDox software and will include a red stamp in the top right corner of each plan sheet upon approval.

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**Smaller** site-related plans or plan revisions that **only need FMO approval** and do not need to go through the formal LDS SDID process **can be submitted directly to the FMO**. Examples: FDC or hydrant relocations, changes to Fire Department access, perimeter fencing or gate installations, fire lane layout or marking revisions, etc.

FMO plan intake staff will reply to applicant to acknowledge receipt of plan submittal form and send a ShareFile link for uploading all pertinent site-related plan sheets or documents. Plan is then reviewed by FMO using Bluebeam software and will include green stamps somewhere on the document(s) upon approval.
