Mr. Chairman - Cub Scout Pack 868 has had a constant presence in the Springfield community and has been chartered by the Springfield Estates Elementary School Parent-Teacher Association for over 50 years. Pack 868 is a pillar of the community and offers an enriching year-round program for children in kindergarten through fifth grade.
