FY 2025 HHS Strategic Allocation of Resources Plan



The HHS Strategic Allocation of Resources (StAR) Plan is a tool to show how the County is making new investments in the Health and Human Services system and advancing the <u>Countywide Strategic Plan</u>. The HHS StAR Plan is not intended to be a funding commitment for specific programs, but a dynamic, transparent, and adaptive way to guide funding decisions based on current community needs.

The HHS StAR Plan is organized by the community outcome areas of the <u>Countywide</u> <u>Strategic Plan</u>. Each funding request in the StAR Plan was submitted for consideration by a County agency as part of the annual budget development process. Linkages to the Countywide Strategic Plan outcome areas and indicators of success are included to demonstrate how these new investments will contribute toward implementation. The funding items in the StAR Plan include both requests that received funding in the FY 2025 Advertised Budget Plan, as well as items that did not receive funding. <u>The funding requests</u> <u>are not ranked by priority or listed by County agency</u>.

Home Delivered Meals: Funding supports growth within the Home Delivered Meals program. Prior to the pandemic, an average of nearly 270,000 meals were provided annually to the Department of Family Services' Adult and Aging clients. The number of participants and meal volume spiked dramatically during the Pandemic. These higher levels have been sustained and a new higher baseline has been established for the program.
