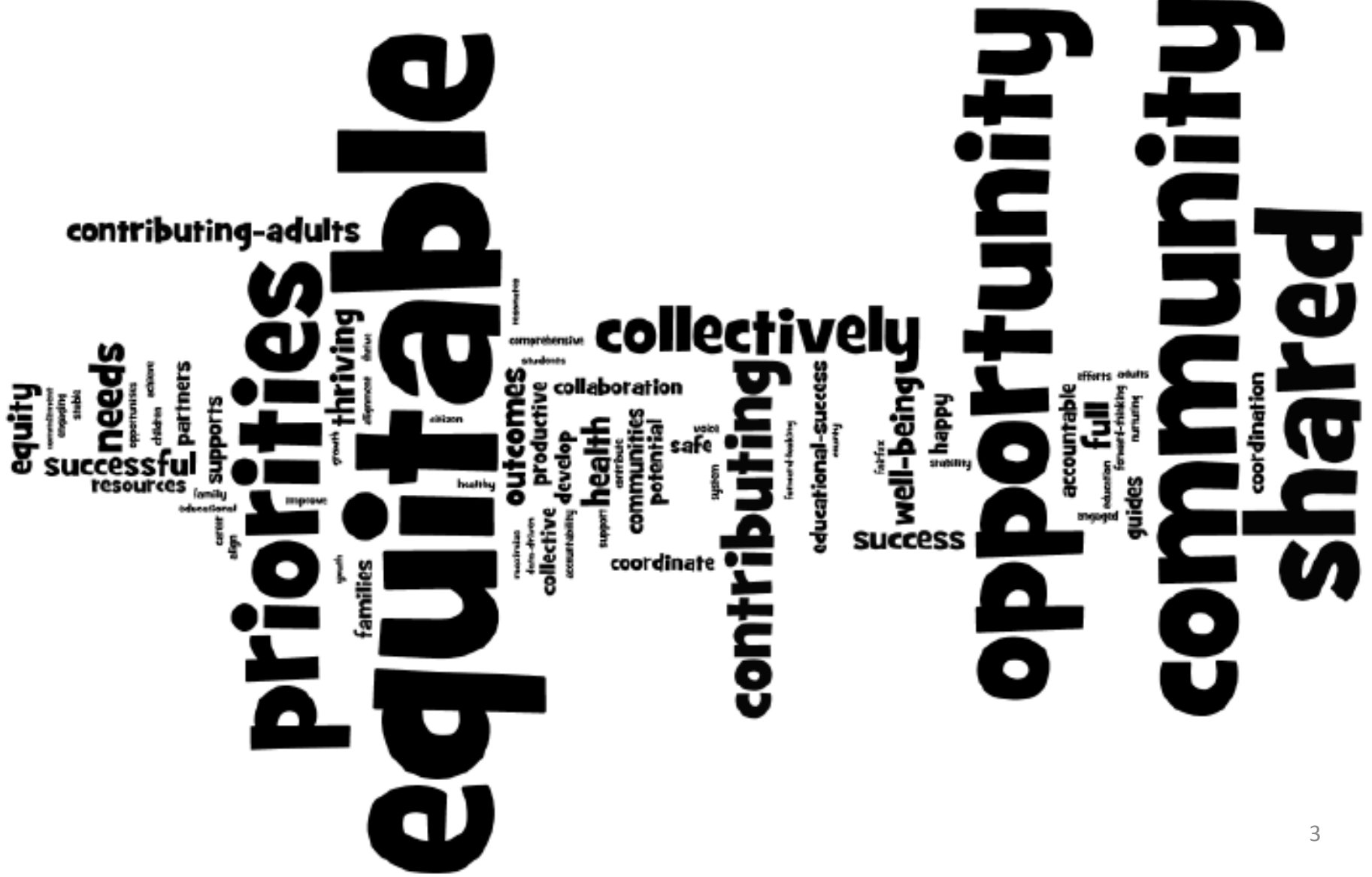
VISION
