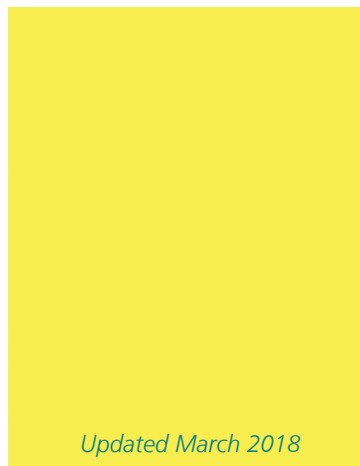

RESOURCES FOR CHILDREN WITH DISABILITIES: MEDICAID WAIVERS

If your child has a disability and meets certain requirements, he/she may be eligible for funding for support services through the Medicaid Waivers. These waivers provide community services that can include, but are not limited to, personal care, respite care, day support, supported employment, and assistive technology. Waiver eligibility is not based on the income of the parents.

Commonwealth Coordinated Care Plus Waiver (CCC Plus Waiver)*

**If eligible, the CCC Plus Waiver may be used while on the waiting list for one of the DD waivers.*

Early Periodic Screening, Diagnosis, and Treatment (EPSDT) Program

Criteria/Application Information

Adults (18+) who are able to live independently in the community. Individuals own, lease, or control their own living arrangements and supports are complemented by non-waiver-funded rent subsidies. Supports are episodic/periodic in nature.

Individuals living with their families, friends or in their own homes and includes supports for those with some medical or behavioral needs. The FIS waiver is available to both children and adults.

Includes residential supports and a full array of medical, behavioral, and non-medical supports. Available to adults and children. May include 24/7 supports for individuals with complex medical and/or behavioral support needs through licensed services.

Must meet nursing facility eligibility criteria including medical needs and functional capacity. Read the Universal Assessment Instrument (UAI) and complete the pre-screening process by calling Fairfax County Coordinated Services Planning or Fairfax County Aging, Disability and Caregiver Resources.

Comprehensive and preventive child health program for individuals under the age of 21, which includes periodic screening, vision, dental, hearing services, as well as therapies and in-home supports.

People on the Developmental Disability (DD) waiting lists are eligible for the Individual and Family Supports (IFSP) Program, an annual \$1000 grant. www.dbhds.virginia.gov/individuals-and-families/developmental-disabilities/community-support-services.
