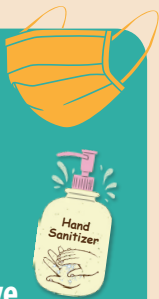


Tips for Creating a Healthy & Safe Workplace

Protect Staff

- Remind employees to protect themselves at work and at home
- Be flexible with sick leave policies and work hours
- Don't require a negative test to return to work



Support Staff

Give employees a few hours during the day to get tested, if asked.
