CONTRACT ITEM C1a Child Specific Contract Request for Youth Villages

ISSUE: Department of Family Services Foster Care and Adoption (DFS-FC&A) request Community Policy & Management Team (CPMT) approval of a child specific Agreement for the Purchase of Services (APOS with Youth Villages for Residential Treatment of Harmony #138841.

<u>RECOMMENDATION:</u> The CSA MT recommends CPMT approval of a child specific APOS with Youth Villages for Harmony #138841 for the Residential Treatment.

MEDICAID ENROLLMENT: Youth Villages is not a Virginia Medicaid participating provider.

<u>LICENSE/ACCREDITATION:</u> Youth Villages Inner Harbour Campus is licensed to operate a residential mental health facility by the Georgia Department of Community Health.

<u>INSURANCE STATUS</u>: Youth Villages is insured at appropriate levels per Fairfax County standards.

#### PROGRAM DESCRIPTION:

The Youth Villages Inner Harbour Campus is one of Georgia's largest psychiatric residential treatment programs for children and youth with serious emotional disturbances. Serving young people throughout the Southeast since 1962, the Inner Harbour Campus merged with Youth Villages in the fall of 2009.

The 1,200-acre woodland setting just outside of Atlanta offers a therapeutic environment that includes a lake, a sports field with a running track and playgrounds for recreational activities. Hiking trails, canoeing activities, a ropes course and equine therapy enhance treatment as well.

Youth Villages Inner Harbour Campus specialize in treating children and adolescents with significant psychiatric illness and impairment in behavioral, cognitive, emotional, familial, and/or social functioning.

A high staff-to-child ratio (5:1) allows for counselors to pay close attention to each child and provide individual therapy. The goal of treatment is to have children learn new, more positive

behavior patterns that will allow them to do well in the community. The ultimate goal is to allow children to return to their families as quickly as possible, whenever possible.

Dialectical Behavior Therapy (DBT) is the treatment model utilized at Inner Harbour. This is a clinical approach for people who are experiencing intense, negative emotions that interfere with their daily lives. These emotions may be expressed outwardly in destructive ways such as angry outbursts, or inwardly by self-destructive behaviors such as suicide attempts, substance abuse, or impulsive actions. The goal of DBT at Inner Harbour is to teach youth more effective ways to regulate their emotions, deal with distressing situations in their lives, and to improve relationships with the people around them.

Their model of Evidentiary Family Restoration aims to restore a supportive family system working with the youth, family and community simultaneously. This program works off DBT concepts and provides weekly individual, family, and recreational therapy. The program also offers bi-weekly group therapy, and daily Milieu support and monitoring. The program model uses data to track youth after discharge provides the evidence basic for their model aiming to decrease recidivism and destructive behaviors.

The campus provides general psychiatric treatment for males and females ages 5-21. Special programs are offered for boys and girls who have:

- Low IQ (50 and above)
- · Problem sexual behaviors
- · Co-occurring medical conditions
- Suicidal and self-harming behaviors
- Aggressive behaviors that are the result of severe emotional problems
- Chronic runaway behaviors with high risk of harm to self or others
- Psychotic symptoms and behaviors
- Significant developmental challenges
- Neurodevelopmental disorders including autism, pervasive developmental disorder NOS, Asperger's, learning disabilities and organic brain syndrome

#### Treatment Components:

- 24-hour nursing care and supervision by a child and adolescent psychiatrist
- Group, individual and family therapy with master's-level counselors
- A highly structured environment
- A 5:1 staff ratio
- Brain-based services for children with significant
- developmental challenges

### OTHER CONTRACTED PROVIDERS CONSIDERED:

All clinically appropriate providers currently under open contract were considered and none were available or appropriate based on the youth's diagnosis and situation.

The child has been denied by placements in Virginia, in addition to multiple out of state placements. The child has aggressive tendencies that have made it difficult and unsafe for him to be stepped down from a residential facility. Relevant local resources and existing CSA contracted providers have been explored and found to be unable to meet this child's/youth's current needs.

Based on these steps, there are no appropriate Medicaid providers of residential treatment services for youth under contract able to serve this youth.
