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BYLAWS (PG 3)

- ☐ CHAIR. The Chair presides over meetings of the CoC Committee and is eligible to vote at all times. The Chair has the authority to delegate appropriate functions to CoC Committee members and to request assistance from the County staff supporting the CoC Committee.
- □ VICE-CHAIR. In the absence of the Chair at a meeting, the Vice-Chair shall perform the duties and exercise the powers of the Chair. If neither the Chair nor the Vice-Chair is available, the member present with the longest tenure on the CoC Committee shall act as Chair.

BYLAWS (PG 4)

□ **VOTING.** A quorum is necessary for a vote. A majority (more than 50%) of the membership of the CoC Committee shall constitute a quorum. In making any recommendations, adopting any plan, or approving any proposal, action shall be taken by a majority vote of CoC Committee members present and voting. Upon the request of any member, the vote of each member on any issue shall be recorded in the minutes. All votes of CoC Committee members shall be taken during a public meeting, and no vote shall be taken by secret or written ballot or by proxy.

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■ HUD REQUIREMENT. "Conducting an annual gaps analysis of the homeless needs and services available within the geographic area" – CoC Program Interim Rule (§ 578.7 Responsibilities of the Continuum of Care)
☐ GOAL. Quantify and prioritize unmet needs (calculation between the estimated amount of need and the current capacity).

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STRATEGIC PLAN: LOOKING BACK

- ☐ 10 Year Plan to Prevent and End Homelessness
 - Year Plan created by a 95-member Implementation Committee with representation from housing development organizations, business and financial institutions, health care and mental health providers, faith communities, employment services, nonprofit service providers and public agencies.
 - **☐** STRATEGIES.
 - 1) Prevention: Keep people from becoming homeless in the first place.
 - 2) Preservation: Increase and preserve affordable housing.
 - 3) Integration: Deliver integrated social services to those who need it.
 - 4) Implementation: Create a community partnership to ensure accountability and funding.
 - □ **RETROSPECTIVE.** The 10 Year Plan ended in 2018 and the <u>Retrospective</u> was crafted to highlight both the successes and challenges.
