HSC-Supported FY 2023 Budget Items

Affordable Housing

- Strongly supports the Board's new goal of accelerating the production of new affordable housing units by 2034
- Additional \$5 million for quality, affordable housing in the County

Consolidated Community Funding Pool

• 5% increase will help community partners deliver high-quality services

Co-Responder Model

Investment will progress the Diversion First initiative

Emergency Rental Assistance

Critical to help residents at risk of eviction

HSC-Supported FY 2023 Budget Items

Employee Compensation

 Recognize that recruiting and retaining high quality staff is fundamental to our HHS system

HHS Contracts

- Support an increase of *at least* \$2.3 million for HHS contracts
- Providers facing same recruitment and retention issues as County agencies

Opioids and Substance Use

 Supports the additional positions and funding for the Detoxification and Residential Treatment Services to address this crisis

Additional Funding Considerations

Should the Board have additional funding available, HSC recommends these items be funded:

Opportunity Neighborhoods: Funding to expand the highly successful Opportunity Neighborhoods program into a sixth area of the County

Services for Older Adults and Adults with Disabilities: Additional Social Services Specialists positions requested by the Department of Family Services for its Adult Protective Services, Adult Services, and Nutrition programs
