ADMINISTRATIVE ITEMS

Admin 5: The Board Authorized advertising public hearings by the Planning Commission and Board of Supervisors for a proposed amendment to the [minor modifications provisions](#) in the Zoning Ordinance. As part of **zMOD** – Zoning Ordinance Modernization Project - the minor modification process is streamlined to better react to changing needs or market conditions.

ACTION ITEMS

Action 1: The Board approved an agreement with the Virginia Department of Rail and Public Transportation to continue ridesharing and transit marketing activities in FY2018.

INFORMATION ITEM

Fairfax County Transportation Status Report

The Fairfax County Department of Transportation (FCDOT) prepared its biannual report to the Board of Supervisors on transportation projects and activities within the county, called the "Fairfax County Transportation Status Report." The report includes an update on all active projects, including those projects in the Third Four-Year Transportation Program for FY2013 through FY2016 and the Transportation Project Priorities (TPP) for funding for FY2015 through FY2020. Under construction:

- **Fairfax County Parkway Bicycle Wayfinding Signage**, *TPP No. 117* (Braddock, Dranesville, Hunter Mill, Springfield, Sully)
- **Herndon Metrorail Station Parking Garage** (Hunter Mill)
- Route 7 Sidewalk (TMSAMS) north side under Route 123 (Providence, Hunter Mill)
- Route 7 Sidewalk (TMSAMS) south side under Route 123 (Providence, Hunter Mill)
- **Vesper Court Trail (TMSAMS)** *Multi-purpose trail from Vesper Court to Route 7* (Hunter Mill)

PUBLIC HEARINGS

The Board held public hearings and approved

- **11587 Springhill Holdings** to permit mixed use development near Spring Hill Metro Station
- **Cars-DB1, LLC** to permit mixed use development. The approval specifies the extension of Boone Boulevard, in the planned grid of streets, would be a 2 lane road with parking and bike lanes
- **Post Trail, LLC** to a retail sales establishment with outdoor display on Sunset Hill Road
- Use of property on Town Center Parkway to be used as a **temporary fire station**, while Reston Station 25 on Wiehlie Avenue undergoes renovation.
