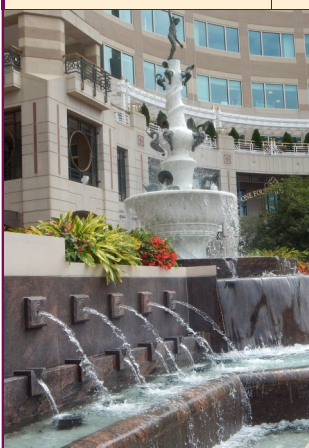

Dear Hunter Mill Friends,

Two recent events really took my breath away. One involved a verbal exchange in a local Trader Joe's and the other was written on the sound wall near the intersection of Town Center Parkway and Baron Cameron in Reston. Both incidences exhibited a much less than welcoming spirit. And that is not how I remember coming to this area.

My early memories of moving into Reston contain images of neighbors greeting the newly arrived gladly and with offers of support. Everyone was warmly received. After all this was the first Open Community in the Commonwealth and it intended to live up to its commitment.

I don't ever recall hearing or seeing messages of hatred like, "I wish they didn't let you in the county" or "Not Your County" in those years. Religious discrimination may have been around but my family wasn't aware of it. Anti-religious comments about Christians, Muslims, Jews, and Buddhists didn't seem a part of this new town. Certainly folks didn't make public statements like "Obama's not in office anymore, you don't have a Muslim in there anymore." Thankfully.

Frankly, the diversity in this part of Fairfax is a major contributor to our overall quality of life.

Finally, I had the honor of meeting Khizr Muazzam and Ghazala Khan, the Gold Star parents of United States Army Captain Humayun Khan, who was killed while serving in the Iraqi War. As you probably remember, they are Pakistani American. You probably also remember that this couple drew wide attention after delivering a speech to the 2016 Democratic National Convention. Most notably, they were mocked by then candidate Trump. Mr. Khan's words to us, laced with kindness and resolve, reminded me that the issue of welcome is as critical today as it ever has been.

We are fortunate to live in a district where incidents of hatred, bigotry, racism and religious intolerance are such a rare abnormality that they make the evening news and go viral on the internet. Clearly, this behavior is not acceptable nor is it the community standard.

Ad Hoc Police Practices Review Commission Update

On May 22nd, Chairman Bulova's office hosted a 1 Year Progress report on the Ad Hoc Police Practices Review Commission Recommendations. This commission, which was created and endorsed by the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors in March of 2015, aims to "engage the community in an open and transparent process to recommend changes that the Commission feels would help the Fairfax County achieve its goal of maintaining a safe community while ensuring a culture of public trust..." Of the 202 recommendations set by the Review Commission, nearly 90% have been implemented or in the process of being implemented.

One of the programs derived from the set of recommendation is **Diversion First**. This program offer alternatives to incarceration for people with mental illnesses or development disabilities who come in contact with the justice system for low level offenses. This programs aims to offer an assessment, treatment and support to individuals rather than penalties. At the end of 2016, the Diversion First program diverted 375 people from potential arrest. Collections of Backpacks and School Supplies Begins

Kids R First is partnering with local organizations and Fairfax County Public Schools to make sure every students begins the school year with needed supplies and a backpack. The annual drive to collect backpacks and donations for school supplies is underway!

Last year, **Cornerstones** collected 3,500 backpacks, which is their target again this year. Preserving Our Forgotten Cemeteries

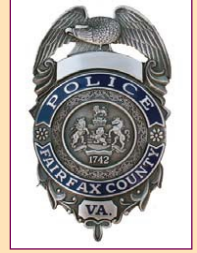

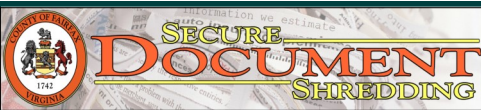
Stay Informed and Help Make Hunter Mill Safe

Transportation



I-66 Corridor Improvements Meetings

Work is underway to transform Northern Virginia's Interstate 66 into a multimodal corridor that moves more people, provides reliable trips and offers new travel options. The **Inside the Beltway project** is converting the existing lanes to dynamically-priced toll lanes operating during the morning (eastbound) and evening (westbound) rush hours. Rush hours will be extended 5:30 am to 9:30 am for eastbound traffic and from 3 pm to 7 pm for west bound. Solo drivers will have the option of paying a toll to use the lanes in the peak direction during rush hour periods. The lanes will remain free for HOV-2+ vehicles (with E-ZPass Flex devices), buses, motorcycles and emergency response vehicles. When the I-66 outside the Beltway express lanes open in mid-2022, the HOV designation inside the Beltway will transition to HOV-3.

The **I-66 Outside the Beltway Project** is a \$2.3 billion public-private partnership of the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) and various external state holders. Improvements encompassed by the Outside the Beltway Project include 22.5 miles of new express lanes alongside three regular lanes from I-495 to University Boulevard in Gainesville, interchange improvements to enhance safety and reduce congestion, including auxiliary lanes between interchanges, and much more.

New BusTracker Provides Real-Time Passenger Information

On May 9, 2017, Fairfax County Department of Transportation (FCDOT) briefed the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors' Transportation Committee on the rollout of the Fairfax Connector **BusTracker** - the transit system's real-time passenger information system that uses global positioning system (GPS) technology to provide estimated arrival times and locations of Fairfax Connector buses. Starting today, Fairfax Connector passengers will be able to access the scheduled and estimated arrival times of their bus by using a smart phone, tablet or a computer. Riders are encouraged to test out the new tool and provide FCDOT their feedback.

Repaving and Restriping Project for Summer 2017

The Fairfax County Department of Transportation (FCDOT) in collaboration with Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) have finalized decisions for restriping four streets in Reston in coordination with VDOT's 2017 summer repaving activities. FCDOT and VDOT held multiple community meetings over the winter and spring to gather feedback on proposals to update the roadway striping on North Shore Drive, Twin Branches Road, Colts Neck Road, and Glade Drive. The proposals for restriping aimed to improve safety, mobility, and accessibility for all road users, whether driving, taking transit, walking or bicycling. The remaining details of the plans are still being finalized, but the following updates are scheduled to occur when the streets are repaved - likely in the summer of 2017:

1) North Shore Drive: Bike lane in one direction and shared lane/sharrows in the opposite direction. Parking will remain on both sides of the street

2) Twin Branches Road: Bike lanes in both directions with parking on one side of the street (alternates sides depending on location). FCDOT is continuing to work with VDOT on pedestrian improvements to add a new crosswalk in the vicinity of Lake Audubon Pool.

3) Colts Neck Road: Implement a road diet, which will result in one travel lane in each direction for vehicles; a center turn lane; and bike lanes in both directions from Glade Drive to Sunrise Valley Drive. There will be one travel lane in each direction and a combination of bike lanes and sharrows from Glade Drive to Reston Parkway; parking remains where it currently exists. FCDOT is continuing to work with VDOT on pedestrian improvements to add a new crosswalk in the vicinity of Hunters Woods Village Center.

4) Glade Drive: Addition of sharrows to existing travel lanes. Parking will remain on both sides of the street.

In addition, FCDOT and VDOT will be collaborating on a study to measure the benefits and impacts of the projects on Twin Branches Road and Colts Neck Road over the next several years. The following roads will repaved this summer without any new lane configuration or addition of bike lanes or sharrows: Cedar Lane, Woodford Road, Meadowlark Road, N Village Road, Wiehle Avenue between Reston Parkway and Red Hawk Circle, Triple Crown Road, Stuart Mill Road, Viking Drive, Pine Crest Road, Franklin Oaks Drive, Oak Lawn Place, New Ambler Court, and New Austin Court.

NEW Applications

Post Trail LLC has filed a Special Exception (SE-2017-HM-010) for the property located at 11150 Sunset Hills Road, Reston, [Tax Map 018-3 ((01)) Parcel 27] to permit the operation of a retail establishment for a 6,841 square-foot bicycle sales and repairs facility. The property is location north of Sunset Hills Road and approximately 300 feet east of Michael Faraday Court. The property is zoned Medium Intensity Industrial District, I-4 and is developed with a 51,825 square-foot three-story office building that was built in 1085. No modifications to the façade of the existing building is planned.

McNair Seniors Apartments, L.P. (Kendrick Court Senior Facility) has filed a Proffer Condition Amendment current with a Final Development Plan Amendment (FDPA 2017-0149 and – FDPA 2017-0150 Temporary IDs) to amend proffers approved with PCA 87-C-060-5 in order to request a change to the age restriction limit, from 62 to 55. The address is 13430 Coppermine Road, Herndon, VA [Tax Map: 016-3 ((01)), Parcel 38D].

1900-02 Campus Commons, LLC has filed a Rezoning and Conceptual Development Plan for approximately 11.6 acres at 1900 – 1902 Campus Commons [Tax Map 17-4 ((1)) Parcels 33 and 34 at the corner of Sunrise Valley Drive and Campus Commons Drive. The Applicant is seeking a mix of residential units and retail space, in addition to maintaining the existing office buildings. Two development options are being proposed: an additional 1,182,435 to 1,183,635 square feet of residential gross floor area with up to 1,097 residential units and between 18,480 and 26,480 square feet of ground retail. This is inclusive of the existing 233,390 square feet of office and 1,980 square feet of retail, with a combined total of 1,419,005 square feet of development.

Comstock Reston Station Holdings, LC has filed a Proffer Condition Amendment (PCA) and Conceptual / Final Development Plans (CDPA/FDPA) applications for 1886 Metro Center Drive, [Tax Map 17-4 ((24)) Parcel 3, 17-4 ((1)) Parcels 17A, 17-4 ((1)) Parcel 17L2 and 17-4 ((1)) Parcel 17L3] to permit an increase in the maximum building heights of three (3) of the eight (8) approved buildings together with a corresponding increase in the Floor Area Ration (FAR) of the project. Comstock is also seeking to facilitate the transfer of any already-entitled hotel use in order to respond to market demand, and to retain the option of adding a second hotel concept to the Project in a later phase of development. Temporary application numbers: PCA 2016-HM-0241, CDPA 2015-0242 and FDPA 2015-0243.

1941 RCP LLC and 1950 RCP LLC filed to rezone the property at 1941 and 1950 Rowland Clarke Place from Planned Residential Community (PRC) district to Planned Residential Mixed Use (PRM) district [Tax Map 74-4 ((14)) (1A) Parcel 2 and 17-4 ((14)) (1A) Parcel 3]. The property is currently developed with an approximately 90,000 square feet, 5-story office building and a 26,000 square foot, 2-story building and two surface parking lots. The property is subject to an approved site plan permitting the redevelopment of the existing office buildings with three new office building of 11, 13 and 15 stories, containing 952,038 square feet of office uses and 62,000 square feet of retail uses, totaling over 1 million square feet, at a cumulative 3.55 floor area ratio. The proposed development will replace the existing office building and surface parking with two optional development plans: 1) a mix of multi-family residential, office, hotel and/or senior living or 2) entirely multi-family residential uses.

Applications Scheduled

A Scimores Academy, LLC (The Floris Conservatory for Fine Arts) has filed a Rezoning (RZ 2016-HM-010) to rezone from R1 to R2, concurrent with Category 3 Special Exception (SE2016-HM-007) for 2625/2633 Centreville Road and 2703/2705 West Ox Road, Herndon [Tax Map 25-1 ((1)) Parcels 16, 21, and 20,927 square feet of Tax Map 25-1 ((1)) Parcel 19.] The Applicant is proposing a fine arts private school of special education (the "Conservatory") for youth from age four (4) through eighteen (18) along with ancillary historic resource and open space. **The Planning Commission voted to recommend approval at the April 26th meeting. The Board of Supervisors public hearing is scheduled for June 6, 2017, at 3:30 pm.**

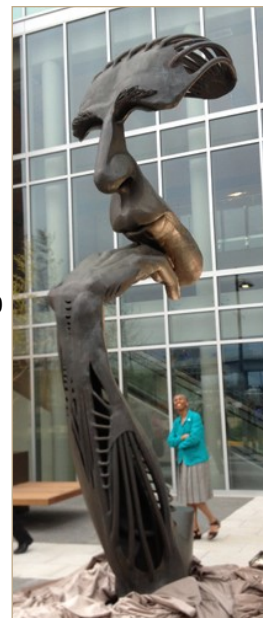
1831 Michael Faraday LLC (Rooney) - Rezoning/Final Development Plan -RZ/FDP 2016-HM-005- to rezone the property located at 1831 Michael Faraday Drive, Reston [Tax Map 18-3 ((6)) Parcel 6] from Industrial 4 to Planned Residential Mixed-Use to construct approximately 230 multi-family units and 13 townhouses, at up to 1.5 FAR. The development will consist of approximately 251,000 square feet of gross floor area, with the potential option to convert 10,000 square feet of residential gross floor area to ground floor retail use. **The Planning Commission public hearing is scheduled for June 15, 2017 at 8:15 pm.**

Anthony J. DeGregorio and Claudia M. DeGregorio have filed a Final Development Plan Amendment (FDPA 87-C-060-19) to add an enclosed gable roof screened porch to be constructed upon existing deck structure. The addition will be 12.7 feet from rear lot line and 3.9 feet from side lot line. The address is 13207 Stable Brook Way, Herndon, VA [Tax Map 025-1 ((14)) (6) Parcel 35]. **The Planning Commission public hearing is scheduled for June 29, 2017 at 8:15 p.m. No Board of Supervisor public hearing is required for a Final Development Plan application.**

Golf Course Overlook, LLC has filed Rezoning/Final Development Plan (RZ/FDP 2016-HM-016) for 11480 Sunset Hills Road, Reston [Tax Map 17-4 ((5))S6 to rezone from Industrial 5 (I-5) and Residential Estate (R-E) to PRM to permit a high-rise residential building containing 413 multi-family units and approximately 1,000 square feet of permitted secondary uses to serve residents. **The Planning Commission public hearing is scheduled for September 27, 2017 at 8:15 pm.**

Reston Planned Residential Community District Amendment Status

Fairfax County's Department of Planning and Zoning (DPZ) held three community meeting on the proposed Planned Residential Community (PRC) District Zoning Ordinance amendment, the last one on May 24th. The Department of Planning and Zoning staff provided additional information regarding the proposed amendment and addressed several of the key questions from earlier meetings.

CARS – DB1 (East) has filed rezoning application RZ 2011-HM-013 for the property located at 8525 Leesburg Pike, Vienna [Tax Map29-3 ((1)) 3B and part of 5]. The Cars application proposes 4.5 million square feet of transit-oriented mix-use development including office, hotel, multi-family residential and retail. **The Planning Commission public hearing is scheduled for Thursday, July 27, 2017 at 8:15 p.m. The Board of Supervisors public hearing is scheduled for Tuesday, September 26, 2017 at 3:30 pm.**

1587 Springhill Holdings, Inc. (Sunbrust) located at Tax Map 029-3 ((1)) 2G has filed a rezoning and Conceptual Development Plan (CDP) application to rezone from Regional Retail - C-7, Highway Corridor Overlay (HC) and Sign Control Overlay (SC) Districts to Planned Tysons Corner (PTC), HC and SC Districts (RZ 2011-HM-027). The property is currently developed with a motel and restaurant that were constructed in 1982. The proposed mixed-use development is near the Tysons West Metro Station and will consist of one office building and two residential buildings, all of which will have ground floor retail. (Note: the one office building may have an option to also be residential.) **The Planning Commission public hearing is scheduled for Thursday, July 27, 2017 at 8:15 p.m. The Board of Supervisors public hearing is scheduled for Tuesday, September 26th, 2017 at 3:30 pm.**

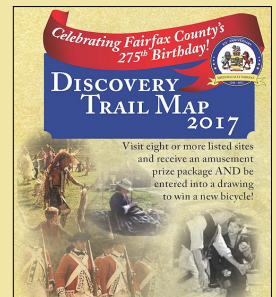

Discover the Milestones in Fairfax County Travel the Discovery Trail Map 2017

Which U.S. President made sure one of Fairfax County's largest parks would be preserved for recreational purposes forever? Which county historical site served for more than 150 years as a church for an integrated congregation starting in the 1790s? Which location once operated a licensed still, and which was known for illegal moonshining? The answers to these questions and more can be found in the Fairfax County Park Authority (FCPA) **Discovery Trail Map 2017**—celebrating the 275th anniversary of Fairfax County.

Now in its fourth year, this popular summer activity encourages participants to explore 12 distinctive parks and discover their history. This year, both children and adults are eligible to win prizes for learning and having fun! Instructions for participating in the activity are included on the map. **The promotion runs from Saturday, May 27 through Monday, Sept. 4, 2017.**
