We also recognized **NOVA Parks** for their **60th anniversary**. NOVA Parks operates two great parks in the Mount Vernon District - Pohick Bay and Occoquan Regional Parks - providing a variety of **invaluable parks and**

recreation space throughout Northern Virginia. Pohick Bay and Occoquan both provide walking and biking trails, boat launches, watercraft rentals and beautiful scenery. Pohick Bay also features golf, camping and Pirate's Cove Waterpark. Occoquan has been recently improved to feature its history, as well as adding an incredible, environmentally friendly event center - The Riverview - and The Brickmaker's Cafe. Late fall is a great time to get visit these parks to enjoy the great outdoors.
