

Cityside Acquired and Converted to All Affordable Housing

In December 2021, **Lincoln Avenue Capital**, a mission driven affordable housing company, acquired the **Cityside Huntington Metro Apartments**, a **569-unit affordable housing property** in the Fairfax section of Alexandria, with financing from the Amazon Housing Equity Fund and Fannie Mae. Rent restrictions are now being imposed on the units for 99 years. This is a big win for our **affordable housing preservation efforts**, and just one more example of **my commitment to leave no one behind** as we revitalize the Richmond Highway Corridor. **Learn more...**

On March 22, the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors officially **raised the bar** for affordable housing by announcing they were **doubling their goal** from producing a minimum of 5,000 units **by 2034 to creating 10,000 net new units** affordable to households earning up to 60 percent area median income. 2022 Paving and Restriping Program

The Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT)'s **Northern Virginia Paving Program** improves hundreds of miles of roads in Fairfax County every year. VDOT and the Fairfax County Department of Transportation FCDOT) use this program as an opportunity to **increase driver, bicyclist and pedestrian safety** with road and crosswalk improvements while minimizing the financial investment in restriping work. The repaving

program can include **limited bike lane, shoulder and crosswalk improvements** with signage and markings. The community is invited to **provide striping-related feedback** by attending a **virtual public meeting on April 19 at 7 p.m.** and/or by **submitting comments online**. Learn more...

I-495 Southside Express Lanes Study

VDOT, in cooperation with the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and other federal, state and local agencies in Virginia and Maryland, is conducting an **environmental study to potentially extend the express lanes system** on the southern section of I-495 (Capital Beltway), by about 11 miles from the **Springfield interchange** (I-95/I-395/I-495) in Fairfax County, Virginia, **across the Woodrow Wilson Bridge**, to



approximately the Maryland 210 interchange in Prince George's County, Maryland. This location was identified in the Commonwealth Transportation Board's adopted I-95 Corridor Improvement Plan as an area for additional study. Learn more...



Monthly Crime Statistic Updates

Fairfax County Police Chief Kevin Davis has begun sharing monthly crime statistics with the Board of Supervisors and I will, in turn, share these statistics with you. These numbers are County-wide and compare 2022 Year-to-Date (YTD) statistics with those of 2021. Highlights shared by Chief Davis:



- 3% '22 vs. '21 crime increase
- 6 homicides 2022 v. 3 homicides 2021 with 100% 2022 closure rate
- Assaults up 9%
- Commercial robberies up 62%
- Carjackings down 60%
- All burglaries down 17%
- Sex offenses down 6%
- Motor vehicle theft up 45%
- Theft of Motor Vehicle Parts up 226%
- Fatal overdoses flat
- Non-Fatal overdoses down 19%

Chief Davis noted crime is being driven by **commercial robberies**, **auto theft and theft of motor vehicle parts** (overwhelmingly catalytic converters). In response, Chief Davis has created a **full-time auto theft squad**.

Parks & Environment

Mount Vernon Rec Center Renovation and Expansion Project

Many of you are aware of the Fairfax County Park Authority (FCPA) plans to **renovate and expand the Mount Vernon Rec Center**, with construction originally scheduled to start last year. Unfortunately, due to **significant supply chain issues and other market factors**, the project cost of the much-needed renovations to the Rec Center has **substantially increased and the project had to be delayed**. This project is a **priority for me** and the FCPA. To keep the project to scale and on time, the FCPA Board considered **five options** ranging from substantially shrinking the project scope to canceling the project altogether. Last month, the FCPA Board made the difficult decision to **temporarily close the facility in early 2023** for the duration of the renovations, estimated to be **no longer than 24 months**. At my request, the FCPA will be hosting a community meeting in early May. The FCPA is committed to **maintaining stability** during this time of transition, and they are doing everything they can to assist in **relocating teams and events** to comparable facilities to minimize impacts. Important Safety Information

Code Compliance - Fences

Whether for privacy or the security of children and pets, **fences are common** on residential properties. **Fence height is regulated** by the Zoning Ordinance, and will depend on the characteristics of the lot. Regulations applicable to the **most common fence height complaints:**

- On a property **less than two acres** in size, fence height in the front yard is limited to **four feet**, and in the side and rear yards it is limited to **seven feet**.
- On a **corner lot**, each yard between the streets and the dwelling is a front yard, where height is limited to **four feet**. The height may be further limited at the intersection of these yards to allow for sight distance.
- Increases in fence height can be sought with **approval of a special permit** by the Board of Zoning Appeals.

COVID-19

Omicron BA.2 Sub-Variant

BA.2, an Omicron sub-variant that has undergone **several genetic changes** from the original Omicron virus, has been **identified in Fairfax County** COVID-19 patients, as well as in other areas across the state, the U.S. and globally. BA.2 is now estimated to be responsible for about one in three COVID-19 infections in the country and **one in five COVID-19 infections in Virginia**. While BA.2 appears to be **more contagious and can spread faster**, it is not known to make people sicker. Learn more...

COVID-19 Vaccinations and Tests Remain Free for all County Residents

Federal dollars that reimburse funds covering **COVID-19 vaccinations and testing for uninsured individuals** is concluding this week. While Congress may consider extending funding, free testing for the uninsured ended in March, and free vaccinations are scheduled to end tomorrow, April 5, for this same group. **At this time, the Fairfax County Health Department (FCHD) will continue to provide vaccinations for all at no charge at county-operated clinics, including pop-up clinics, held throughout the community. 2nd Booster Recommended

The FDA authorized, and the **Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC)** recommended, a **second booster dose of a COVID-19** mRNA vaccine for three groups of individuals:

- Persons who are aged 50 years and older.
- Persons who are aged 18-49 years who received the Johnson & Johnson/Janssen COVID-19 vaccine as both their primary series dose and booster dose.
- Persons aged 12 years and older whose immune system is moderately or severely impaired based on disease or medications they are taking.

Fairfax County Health Department Website Data Dashboard Update

The Fairfax County Health Department announced that it has updated its COVID-19 data dashboard. The changes follow recent updates made by the Virginia Department of Health (VDH) and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) to their dashboards. Updates to the Health Department's dashboard mirror VDH and CDC updates, which now places an emphasis on outbreaks in high-risk settings and removes data that are no longer being comprehensively collected.
