Saving the Environment

Dyke Marsh Restoration

Construction began on the **1,500-foot breakwater** as part of the National Park Service's **Dyke Marsh Restoration Project**. The breakwater will help **shield the existing and planned restored marsh from erosion** and will help **re-establish the marsh's ability to regenerate naturally** within the preserve's historic footprint through the collection of sediment. Once completed, the vital project will provide a **storm buffer** for the historic and scenic George Washington Memorial Parkway, a **natural filter** to clean the Potomac River, and habitat for a variety of plants and wildlife.

Completion of the breakwater is scheduled for December 2019. Sometime later this summer or early fall, the Corps also plans to award a contract for approximately 5.45 acres of wetland restoration at Dyke Marsh.

Quick Tip: No Plastic Bags in Recyling Bins

Fairfax County Public Works asks that you **please don't put plastic bags in recycling bins**. The bags often get wrapped around rollers and stop conveyor belts from processing recyclable materials. Workers then remove the bags by hand. Plastic bags

that make it past the rollers can contaminate other recyclable materials. Please take plastic bags back to grocery stores, **choose reusable bags** or place them in the trash. <u>Here's more information</u> on what to always place in your recycling bin and what to never place.

Funds Available to Plant Trees on County Properties and in Common Open Space

The **Tree Preservation and Planting Fund** was established to support projects to **preserve existing trees** and **plant new trees** by County agencies and **non-profit tree planting organizations** on both public properties and homeowner association commonly-owned open space. **Homeowner associations** can partner with non-profits to submit project proposals and schools can also apply to fund projects with Tree Preservation and Planting Funds. Proposals are reviewed by an inter-agency panel including representatives from Fairfax County Urban Forest Management Division, Stormwater Planning Division, Tree Commission, and NoVA Soil and Water Conservation District. **Application information** is available **online**. **Read more...**

Potholes

Who is supposed to fix that **pothole**? Where do I report a **missing street sign**? Or who do I call about **snow removal** – although we don't have to worry about that for a couple of months. Answering these questions about any road segment requires a person to know who maintains it. In Fairfax County, the answer can vary: Is it Fairfax County, VDOT, public schools, a private entity or



some other? **To get answers to these questions**, you can use the <u>Road Maintenance mapping application</u> on the Fairfax County <u>website</u>. Open the application and either search for an address or zoom into a desired area on the map. All road segments are color-coded by their maintenance responsibility. **Clicking on a road segment** will open a window giving the street name and maintenance responsibility. The application also has tools for measuring, changing the base map (to aerial imagery, for instance) and printing for user convenience. With the Road Maintenance mapping application, who to call for maintenance need not be a mystery anymore.
