George Washington Parkway Study

Monday's deadly crash again highlighted the **need for safety improvements** on the George Washington (GW) Parkway. I join Representative Don Beyer in **urging the National Park Service** (NPS) to again **expedite its traffic study** of the GW Parkway in the wake of this fatal crash.

The NPS has responded that the **study is underway** and to date has included **collecting and analyzing historical vehicular**, **pedestrian and bicycle crash data**. Next steps include a



New Concrete Plant Opens In Lorton



Chaney Enterprises has **opened a new facility** at 9520 Gunston Cove Road, directly off Interstate 95. Officials say it's **expected to create about a dozen new jobs**. It's Chaney's first plant in Fairfax County. In a statement, Mount Vernon District Supervisor Dan Storck said that "companies, like Chaney, that are **passionately committed to their communities, work and environment**, align well with our priority to continue to **create a diverse and healthy**

Regional Approach to Glass Recycling Leads to Creation of the Purple Can Club

Fairfax, Alexandria, Prince William and Arlington recently announced a **new strategic partnership** to **recover and recycle glass**. In Northern Virginia, glass collected in curbside recycling bins is sent to recycling facilities where



it **eventually ends up in landfills**. During the transportation process to the facility glass is broken and becomes mixed with recycling residue (small bits of plastic and paper) as part of the sorting process, **making it unrecoverable**. To tackle this challenge, these jurisdictions have committed to **collecting glass via purple glass-only drop-off containers** and bringing it to Fairfax County's **"Big Blue" processing plant**, where it will be recycled for use in a variety of projects.
