Fairfax County Fire and Rescue Department (FCFRD) was selected as **one of 50 departments nationwide** to participate in the **beta testing phase** of the **National Emergency Response Information System** (NERIS). Previously, FCFRD was selected as one of the first six fire

departments in the country to pilot NERIS. This new system aims to modernize the nation's fire and emergency data. The selection was highly competitive with **over 330 departments volunteering**. County Opens Survey to get Input about Proposed Countywide Zero Waste Strategies

Each week, Fairfax County residents produce over **23,000 tons of waste**- the weight of **over 4,000 elephants**! While some of this is recycled or composted, over half of the waste is thrown away and incinerated or landfilled. As the County works toward addressing this concern, the Department of Public Works and Environmental Services is **requesting feedback** from residents on their **current trash and recycling**



practices and their opinion on **proposed countywide zero waste strategies** through a quick online survey on the Public Input platform. The survey is **open through September 30**. Learn more.



Supporting Your Garden Through Heat and Drought

We all know the **climate is getting hotter**. More violent storms, compounded by periods of drought, creates water run off rather than absorption. These changes have not gone unnoticed by local gardeners. **Most plants require supplemental watering** when newly planted, but this year even well-established and well-sited plants are **struggling in the heat** and drought.

Native plants have the advantage of being **adapted** to our local conditions, but what happens when those conditions change? Going forward, here are some **gardening strategies** to consider:

- Shop for **drought-resistant plants**
- Site plants in each own's preferred shade or sun location
- Monitor ground moisture to avoid over or under watering
- Use mulch to cool soil and reduce evaporation
- Plant living plants as "green mulch"
- Plant more trees to increase shade (pull turf grass away from tree trunks out to the drip line)

Supporting Our Students

School Immunization Requirements

In Virginia, it's required by law for students to have **certain immunizations** to **attend school**. This is supported by guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the Virginia Department of Health and **Fairfax County Public Schools** Regulation 2101.



Starting Monday, September 30, students who have not provided proof of immunization will not be allowed to attend school. You can check your child's immunization compliance by accessing ParentVUE. Families should submit their child's completed immunization records before September 30.

Families of students with incomplete immunization records need to provide **acceptable proof of immunization** to their child's school as soon as possible. You can find the list of required immunizations on the General Registration Immunizations webpage. If your child's **immunizations are incomplete**, here's what you **need to do**:

- Get your child's immunization record from one of these places:
 - Request immunization records for free through the Virginia Immunization Information System (VIIS).
 - If your child was immunized outside Virginia, get records from those states' systems.
 - Request records from your healthcare provider. Some may charge for copies.
 - Submit your child's immunization record to your child's school.

Important Safety Information

Code Compliance - Signs

The Zoning Ordinance defines a sign and regulates signs through Article 7 (Sign Ordinance). This ordinance seeks to protect and enhance communities a few different ways, including the prohibition of moving or windblown signs, such as inflatables or feather flags and any sign that displays flashing or animated lights. Signs that are temporary and removable, but not prohibited, may be deemed minor signs. Minor signs can include those on storefront windows, which up to 30% coverage is allowed; however, the following applies if a storefront sign is illuminated:

- 4 square feet maximum
- limited to business hours
- no flashing on and off
- no changeable copy (it can only show one message example: "OPEN")

Other signs, like the sign that lets you know the various stores in a shopping center, are allowed through permit processes.

If a sign is **along a roadway**, it is probably in the **Virginia Department of Transportation right-of-way** ("VDOT ROW" or "ROW"). Fairfax County obtained VDOT permission for the Department of Code Compliance (DCC) to have an Illegal Sign Removal Program for 99 heavily traveled ROWs. More information is on DCC's ROW Sign Removal Program flyer.

DCC is here to help – if you have questions, want to make a report or if you are the subject of enforcement and need assistance.
