

Fairfax County Government

Fairfax County's elected Board of Supervisors consists of nine members elected by district, plus a chairman elected at-large. Board members are elected for four-year terms and establish county government policy, pass resolutions and ordinances, approve the budget, set local tax rates, approve land use plans and make appointments to various positions.

In addition to our office, The Gerry Hyland Governmental Center is located at 8350 Richmond Highway, Alexandria, VA 22309. The Fairfax County Government Center is located at 12000 Government Center Parkway, Fairfax, VA 22035.

We offer meeting space for non-profit organizations and residents of Fairfax County for civic, cultural, educational, religious, recreational and similar activities of a non-profit nature and for inter-governmental purposes at no cost to the user. Enrolling Children in School

To enroll your children in school you may call 703-329-9831 to find

out which school serves your new address or you may use the FCPS boundary locator at <u>http://</u> <u>boundary.fcps.edu/boundary</u>. You may also visit the Fairfax County Public School's website and download the necessary forms to enroll students at <u>www.fcps.edu/parents/start</u>. To



register your child you will also need proof of residency, proof of birth, documentation of previous education programs and health documentation.

Registering to Vote

You may register to vote year-round except during the 21 days prior to a General or Primary election, 13 days prior to a special election, or 6 days prior to a special election called by the Governor (Code of Virginia §§ 24.2-416). To register you must be a citizen of the United States, at least 18 years of age by the next general election, and a resident of Virginia.

You may vote Absentee in person at the Fairfax County Government Center at 12000 Government Center Parkway in Fairfax Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Friday, 8 a.m.—4:30 p.m., and Thursday, 8 a.m.—7 p.m. If you have any questions you may call 703-222-0776, fax 703-324-2205, or call 703-324-4700 for 24-hour recorded information.
