At Tuesday's Board of Supervisor's meeting the Board authorized the advertisement of **the FY 2021 County budget**, Capital Improvement Program, and the **real estate tax rates that are proposed to support the Proposed FY 2021 Budget**. The County Executive recommended a **3 cent increase in the current real estate tax rate** of \$1.15 to a rate of \$1.18 per \$100 of assessed value in FY 2021. Please note, this is **NOT the final tax rate**. The BOS has the option to **consider a lower tax rate**, but **cannot go higher** than the advertised \$1.18 per \$100. Of the 3 cent increase, **1**

cent will go directly to increase affordable and workforce housing in the County.

The Board received an update on the **Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19)** from County Health Director Dr. Gloria Addo-Ayensu and Director of Epidemiology Dr. Benjamin Schwartz. The presentation emphasized the need for **preventative measures like hand washing and self-quarantining** if you are ill, just like any other influenza illness. It also noted the many resources and plans the County is putting in place to **prevent the spread of COVID-19** and to help if there is a community outbreak. Fairfax County will continue to be a **trusted source for information** throughout this situation, with **regular updates** posted to the **website**. **Watch the presentation the Board received** for the latest information.

It was my privilege to recognize Coach Gerry Pannoni and the South County Stallion football team for winning the State championship and to make several declarations including designating March as Women's History Month, Developmental Disabilities Inclusion Month and Alternative Dispute Resolution Month.
