Dear Neighbors,

Yesterday the Board of Supervisors (BOS) met for an abbreviated session, with appropriate social distancing, to **address critical County issues**. Just like you, we are all adjusting our daily lives to**respond to the COVID-19 pandemic** and **support our residents and businesses**. During the meeting, we announced:

- Extended deadlines for Personal Property Taxes until June 1, 2020, and Real Estate Taxes until August 28, 2020.
- All County parks and amenities will be closed until further notice, except walking trails.
- All County buildings will be closed to the public starting Friday, March 27 at 5 p.m. The County government remains open for business online, by phone and mail. See our Assistance from a Distance webpage for more information.

The Board took actions at the meeting to ensure continuity of government and its services. The first action item addressed by the BOS was to adopt a **policy to permit Board members to participate in meetings electronically** from remote locations. This policy has been discussed by the Board previously, but this is the **first time it has become necessary**. Allowing Board members to participate electronically is just another **tool we will use** to keep the **important business of the County** government moving forward.

The Board also approved an ordinance to **permit the entire Board to meet electronically**, should it be unsafe or impractical to meeting in-person, to address matters
related to the **continuity of the County Government**. The Board is committed to **supporting our residents and businesses in this challenging time**.

### **Action Items**

**Item 1:** Adopt a written **policy allowing for and governing** participation by electronic communication means. *The full item can be read on pages 5 - 9 of the Board Package.* 

Item 2: Adopted an ordinance to establish methods to assure continuity of Fairfax County government during the Novel Coronavirus 2019 (COVID-10) emergency. The ordinance establishes that the Board of Supervisors will follow FOIA's usual procedures (including the provisions of its electronic meeting policy) whenever possible. If, in the Chairman's judgment, it is unsafe to assemble a physical quorum, a fully electronic meeting may be held in accordance with FOIA's existing provisions to address the emergency itself. If the Chairman determines that any meeting is being conducted for the purpose of assuring continuity in Fairfax County government and the usual procedures cannot be implemented safely or practically, then the ordinance provides a method for conducting an electronic meeting to address matters related to the continuity of the County Government. For any matter that requires a public hearing, the Board would allow the receipt of public comment by written or electronic communication rather than in-person testimony. # Relocate the Polling Places for the Lorton Precinct in the Mount Vernon District

Adopted an ordinance to **move the polling place for the Lorton precinct** from the Lorton Library located at 9520 Richmond Highway, Lorton, **to the Lorton Station Elementary School**, 9298 Lewis Chapel Road, Lorton, where it will be **colocated with the Lorton Station precinct**. The current polling place, Lorton Library, will be closing for renovation on April 11, 2020. The polling place for Lorton precinct is **expected to return to the Lorton Library when it reopens in <b>2021**. The full item can be read on pages 225 - 248 of the Board Package.

## **Inova Updates**

Starting Wednesday, March 25, Inova Urgent Care (UCC) locations at Dulles South, North Arlington, and Tysons will staff Respiratory Illness Clinics to evaluate all patients with respiratory illness symptoms. The three clinics will also be able to collect samples for COVID-19 testing via physician ordered vehicle-side appointments.

Before visiting any Inova Respiratory Illness Clinic, take the following steps:

- Contact your **regular physician for evaluation**. For assistance with recommendations, to arrange for a physician appointment, or **if you do not have a primary care physician**, call 1-855-IMG-DOCS.
- Your regular physician can evaluate your symptoms to determine if testing is needed based on COVID-19 testing criteria and provide a testing order, or refer you to the Inova Respiratory Illness Clinic for evaluation.
- Upon arrival at the Inova Respiratory Illness Clinic, a clinician will**greet the patient** at their vehicle to collect samples for a physician-ordered test, or escort the patient into the respiratory clinic for evaluation.
- For patients who undergo COVID-19 testing, a UCC nurse will contact those whose
  results are negative. For patients with positive results, a UCC nurse will
  coordinate with the patient's regular physician for notification and further
  instructions. Patients who are tested can expect results in roughly 4-7 days.
