## A MESSAGE FROM SUPERVISOR STORCK

Yesterday's Board of Supervisors (BOS) meeting opened with a rousing **Presentation of the Colors** by the **Army Continental Color Guard** and an element of the **Old Guard Fife and Drum Corps**. This presentation marked the Board's designation of June 9 - 16, 2018, as **Army Week** in Fairfax County. The relationship between the US Army and Fairfax County is **important and integral to both organizations**. ### ADMINISTRATIVE ITEMS

Admin 4: The Board authorized a public hearing on amendments to the Employees' and Uniformed Retirement Systems to eliminate the 5 percent reduction of Social Security benefits. The hearing is scheduled for July 10, 2018 at 4:00 p.m.

## **ACTION ITEMS**

Action 1: The Board approved a project agreement with the Department of Rail and Public Transportation (DRPT), to enable the County to receive FY 2018 funding for the I-95 Transit and Travel Demand Management (TDM) Plan operating assistance. The I-95 Corridor Transit and TDM Plan was developed to provide the Commonwealth with recommendations, including both operations and capital investments, to complement the I-95 High Occupancy Toll/High Occupancy Vehicle (HOT/HOV) lanes improvements. Action 5: The Board approved an **agreement** with the Commonwealth to use federal Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality (CMAQ) and state matching **funds in the amount of \$332,294 to promote Transportation Demand Management (TDM) programs** in FY 2019. This funding will be used to **decrease air pollution by promoting alternative commuting modes**. *The full item can be read on pages 154 - 174 of the Board Package*.

# Recognition for Richard Bierce for 30 years of service to the Architectural Review Board and Fairfax County

Since November 1987, **Richard Bierce** has been a **fixture on the Fairfax County Architectural Review Board (ARB)**, where he has served as both chairman and vice-chairman. Mr. Bierce started his **own practice in 1989** as a **Historical Architect and Preservation Consultant** and worked on projects that included **assessing damage to historic properties** after hurricanes in the U.S. Virgin Islands and Puerto Rico, **evaluating the significance of early 20th century schools** in Tampa, Florida and restoring St. Paul's Church in Alexandria, Virginia.

Mr. Bierce's accomplishments are comprehensive, with many of his most **noteworthy works completed pro bono**. One of his first and most indelible ARB duties was to **establish**, **preserve and protect 13 Historic Overlay Districts** in the County. He has advocated for the **protection and care of historic buildings**, including the Laurel Hill Adaptive Reuse site, the **Woodlawn and Arcadia partnership**, and the **Workhouse Arts Center**. With almost 50 years as a Historical Architect and Preservation Consultant, he has worked on projects throughout Fairfax County, the state of Virginia, and nationwide.

### Action

Directed staff to issue a proclamation to recognize Richard Bierce for his many accomplishments to be presented at a future Board meeting.

# Joint Board Matter with Supervisor Jeff McKay: Exploration of Options to Paint Water Towers

Since this Board adopted the **Embark Comprehensive Plan Amendment** in March, Supervisor Storck and I have been meeting with various stakeholders and County staff to bring it to life.

As a part of that work, my office fielded a question about what it would take to **paint the water towers** along Richmond Highway to **complement Embark**.

We are aware of the great work done in Tysons in conjunction with the Partnership on the water tower there, and we would like to **explore a similar initiative along the Corridor**.

#### Action

Directed staff to prepare a memo to the Board outlining the steps necessary to achieve such a project, to include the approvals that would be necessary and potential funding estimates and options that might be considered.

## PUBLIC HEARINGS THAT IMPACT THE MOUNT VERNON DISTRICT

### Proposed Zoning Ordinance Amendment - Minimum Required Rear Yard Coverage Limitations for Single-Family Detached Dwellings

The Board approved a zoning ordinance amendment to **provide residents with increased flexibility** in the use of their rear yards. It also would **clarify interpretations** regarding the calculation of the minimum required rear yard and make an editorial amendment regarding size limitations on **children's playhouses**. *The full item can be read on pages 198 - 235 of the Board Package.*
