Mr. McLaughlin called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. Roll was called, and a quorum was present.

#### **ADMINISTRATIVE ITEMS**

The meeting minutes from the virtual meeting on March 17 were approved.

#### CHAIRMAN REPORT

Mr. McLaughlin stated that he had sent the letter that was discussed at the March 17 meeting regarding increasing the NCS scholarship program funding from \$150,000 to \$300,000. Mr. McLaughlin also testified to the BOS regarding that letter. Mr. McLaughlin encouraged all district reps to contact their Supervisor regarding scholarship funding letter.

Mr. McLaughlin and the rest of the Council leadership is term limited. Mr. McLaughlin and Mr. Thompson will put together and slate of candidates and will announce at the May meeting. Anyone interested in one of the positions should contact Mr. McLaughlin and Mr. Thompson for further information.

#### COMMITTEE REPORTS

#### Best Practices for Sports Organizations

Ms. Pape Daniels will chair the best practices for sports organizations committee. There are 8 additional members on the committee and the first meeting will be on May 5. The goal of the first meeting is to narrow down what additional resources people are interested in seeing and deciding what information should not be included.

Ms. Avvisato stated that the Field Allocation committee and Scholarship committee need to reconvene. If members are interested in joining either committee, please contact NCS. Mr. Thompson explained the Field Allocation committee will not be looking at the entire policy. It will focus on the section addressing tournaments and potential issues resulting from a new tournament complex coming online.

Mr. Flather stated that the Sports Tourism Implementation committee also needs to meet to revisit the pilot test for tournaments and make sure it is collecting pertinent data.

#### REPORTS BY SPORTS REPRESENTATIVES

#### Fast Pitch Softball

Ms. Willemssen praised NCS, FCPA and FCPS for their coordination in helping to support a 100-team softball tournament a couple weeks ago. There will be another softball tournament in July that is a fundraiser for Children's National Hospital.

#### Football

Mr. Hollingsworth reported football is currently in its off season and had nothing further to report.



#### Soccer

Ms. Bauer and Ms. Moxie reported that the spring season underway. They are hopeful that everyone continues to adhere to COVID-19 protocols and guidelines.

#### STATUS REPORT FROM COUNTY REPRESENTATIVES

#### **FCPS**

Ms. Meren urged everyone to continue to adhere to COVID-19 protocols.

Mr. Curran reported FCPS adjusted its mask policy for outdoor sports. Athletes no longer must wear a mask while competing, however, masks must still be worn on the sidelines. FCPS will continue to monitor the change.

Mr. Curran was pleased to report the FCPS fall season is almost complete. Mr. Curran will give a full report on state championship participating schools at the May meeting once the season is complete. The spring season is underway, and competition starts soon. The spring season goes a little longer this year than previous years. Mr. Curran reported that 6 high schools will also be hosting graduations this spring.

#### **FCPA**

Mr. Louis reported the Patriot Park North contract award process is still ongoing.

Mr. Thompson reported the Park Authority is still in the process of hiring a new Director. It hopes to have a new Director in place by the fall.

#### NCS

Ms. Avvisato stated that NCS is working on summer gym scheduling. There are not as many gyms available this summer due to summer programs and school storage needs. NCS continue to work closely with Health Department to keep athletes safe.
