COMMITTEE REPORTS

APRT

Ms. Willemssen reported that the APRT funding has been approved by the BOS. A lot of exciting things going on at Wakefield Park. Ms. Willemssen praised the collaboration from all parties involved with the APRT.

Ms. Eckert gave an update on the improvements included in the APRT funding for Wakefield Park. The improvements will begin November 1 and be completed before the end of March so there should be no impact to the community users.

Mr. Flather expressed his frustration at a lack of response from FCPS on the ongoing cancelations. Mr. Flather explained that the Council had sent a letter to the School Board several months ago and has yet to receive any response or update which is frustrating.

Mr. Curran stated that he briefly spoke with Dr. Reid and Dr. Anderson, and they are aware of the issue and are taking steps to address it. Mr. Curran offered to facilitate setting up a meeting with the committee members and Dr. Reid and Dr. Anderson to find out what steps have been taken and to get an update on the letter that was sent on behalf of the Council.

Stephen A. McLaughlin Fairfax County Champions of Character

Mr. Martino reviewed the current nominations of the ceremony and reminded the Council that the deadline to submit nominations is August 1. NCS will resend the nomination information and asked the Council to please reach out to organizations to get nominations.

The Council had a discussion on which sports could be included for nominations and whether high school athletes could be nominated for awards.

Field Allocation Policy

Ms. Bauer said one issue she is seeing throughout the County is groups breaking off larger organizations and creating their own because they are unhappy. Fairfax County fields are already saturated, and these break off groups are demanding field space. Some of these groups are also for-profit groups that have connected with non-profit entities to gain field space. These are two major things Ms. Bauer is seeing in the soccer community that the committee needs to address.

Fast Pitch Softball

Ms. Willemssen was pleased to announce that 2 Fairfax County high schools, McLean High School and Madison High School, played in the Virginia high school state championship game with McLean HS winning the state championship.

Mr. Baily reported that George Mason University recently hosted the Men's Division 1 National Championship at the end of May.

Volleyball recreation leagues had their championships in May. Club volleyball teams are still going through Nationals and have about 2-3 weeks remaining.

The Fairfax County Volleyball Council met last month and requested help updating the Council's by-laws. NCS will have Mike Thompson reach out to the Volleyball Council to assist them in updating the by-laws.

Mr. Baily reported that he sent a message to Mr. Curran and others about trying to help with training of coaches because the volleyball community has realized there is a shortage of coaches so they're trying to bring the organizations together to help with that.

The boys high school volleyball discussions continue with FCPS and are starting to plan for the league they are running in the fall.

STATUS REPORT FROM COUNTY REPRESENTATIVES

FCPS

Mr. Curran gave an update on the middle school sports program. Mr. Curran stated that cross country is being offered in the fall and track in the spring at all 26 middle schools. There is quite a bit of detail in planning and training of coaches and coordinators. FCPS is reaching out to retirees and high school coaches to help with the coordination, and they
