MEETING OPENING

Ms. Bauer called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m. Roll was called, and a quorum was present.

The Council had several questions on the presentation that included the following:

- How many athletic fields have been fulfilled?
- Where does the County stand on promised proffers?
- Who has met their commitment and who is delinquent?
- Is there potential to buy-out of proffers? If so, is it a set amount or case by case?

FCPA staff explained they are still in the early stages of collecting information and will take the Council's questions and follow-up at the November Council meeting.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

After-School Middle School Sports

Ms. Bauer explained that the Council had created a committee to discuss the after-school middle school sports programs.

Mr. Tom Horn and Mr. Fernando Belli from Fairfax County Public Schools explained the process of how the after-school middle school sports program came to be. Mr. Horn and Mr. Belli stated their office learned of the program 8 months ago and learned what the initiative entailed roughly 4 months ago. The current program plans to offer cross country in the fall and track and field in the spring. Mr. Horn and Mr. Belli have encountered staffing issues as there is no extra staff available for these programs. Staff must be hired and trained.

There are roughly 1,600 students participating in the program this fall. There are 4 cross country meets planned in the fall, with 3 sites for each meet. Meets are 8:00 a.m. – 12:30 p.m. with the 1st meet being 9/30 and then 10/14, 10/21 and 10/28. FCPS will identify the spring sites by November 1 and inform NCS.

The Council inquired about using high school stadium fields to make up for time they were canceled due to the cross country meets. FCPS is willing to work with NCS and the user groups to try to free up stadium time on Saturday mornings.

The Council had concern with the potential impact to youth organizations in the County that currently offer these sports. Children will have to choose between after-school middle school sports and youth organization. Some organizations may stop offering certain sports because of lack of participation. What happens if the after-school middle school sports program funding goes away, and these organizations don't offer these sports in the future?

Communications with Fairfax County Partners – FCPS, FCPA, NCS and Community Users Mr. Flather and the Council are extremely frustrated with the FCPS cancelations this fall. Mr. Flather explained the committee was created about 2 years ago and it seems the community users are in no better position with the cancelations. Communication has improved between FCPS and NCS, however the cancelations remain an issue. FCPS changed the deadlines for schools to get their events in based on the NCS scheduling seasons and that is still not happening.

Ms. Bauer and Mr. Flather have reached out to Ms. Megan McLaughlin, the School Board representative for the Athletic Council. She agrees there is an issue and has initiated a meeting with NCS, FCPS and community users to discuss the issues and hopefully move forward with some solutions.

Mr. Hahne echoed Mr. Flather's concerns and listed items that need to happen moving forward:

- 1. NCS needs to be the advocate for community users, not FCPS.
- 2. Notice 8420 deadline accountability (late school events must go to community users to clear space)
- 3. Council representatives need to attend high school DSA meetings bi-annually.
- 4. Community users are held to standard, needs to be reciprocal with FCPS.

Mr. Taylor inquired about the training FCPS did with the schools on entering school events on time. Ms. Garner confirmed that new principals were trained on the impact of cancelations to community use. All staff that have access to FSDirect were also retrained on how to cancel NCS events when necessary and the importance of entering school events before permits are issued by NCS. Ms. Garner stated that the PTA events are a lot of the events causing cancelations. Community use had done multiple trainings with the PTA groups. The issue is PTAs elect their new committee in July, however they do not have the ability to organize and get their events in by the deadline. Community use is going to review events for every elementary PTA for the past 2 years and remind schools to enter events that they don't see on the calendar that they have had historically.

Mr. Martino was pleased to announce that nominations for all categories for each magisterial district have been received and the committee has selected the winners. Official invitations for the ceremony on October 17 will be sent to the Council. Mr. Martino reminded the Council that Mr. McLaughlin's family will be in attendance and will receive an award as well.

Baseball

Mr. Hahne praised the hard work of everyone involved in the Patriot Park North complex. The complex hosted 29 events in its first year and has 31 events planned for year 2. Mr. Hahne reminded the Council of the Capital One Park baseball field that is free for community use. The field will also be host to Georgetown University and Marymount College baseball games. Football

Mr. Meana reported that the Fairfax County Youth Football League season started last weekend. The referee situation is currently adequate, and the season has started off positively. Mr. Meana has also noticed the Washington Commanders football team has been sincerely reaching out to the community to try to mend the relationship between the team and community.

Soccer

Ms. Bauer stated that the Soccer Council is interested in looking at participation numbers for the past few years as she has received several reports that soccer participation is high across the County. Ms. Bauer reported that school cancelations have had an impact this fall, especially the short notice cancelations. Ms. Bauer explained to the Council that the Soccer Council is working on a better process to give back unused space so that NCS may reallocate to other groups.

Volleyball

Mr. Baily reported that Reston Hoops Volleyball is planning their inaugural fall season. They have Coed 4th-6th grade and girls and boy's 7th-8th grade. Mr. Baily explained that full net systems have been installed at Aldrin ES and there are planning discussions regarding doing a similar installation at Dogwood ES.

Mr. Bailey stated that boys' club volleyball tryouts start next weekend and boys elementary and middle school league is kicking off matches this weekend. There are currently 6 elementary school and 10 middle school teams participating.

Mr. Baily explained that high school boys' volleyball kicked off last weekend. There are 48 teams this season which is up from 35 teams' last fall. Boys are forming interest clubs at high schools and 14 of the 25 high schools have formed interest clubs and the remaining should be complete by the end of October. Mr. Baily is continuing to work with Dr. Reid and the School Board to keep moving boys' high school volleyball to a varsity sport.
