Basic Career Services

- Job seekers and employers in Northern Virginia have access to a comprehensive system of employment and training services and resources delivered and coordinated through one-stop employment resource centers, locally known as Virginia Career Works Centers.
- Services are offered at no cost and include:
 - o Resume writing and interview preparation workshops.
 - o Career coaching.
 - o Basic employment assessments.
 - $\circ\;$ Access to computers, phones, copiers, and the internet for employment search.
 - o Job lead assistance.
 - o Ongoing customer support.



Fairfax Workforce Centers



Virginia Career Works Northern – Annandale Center Virginia Career Works Northern – Alexandria Center Reston Employment Resource Center VIEW Job Center (Fairfax)

- Provide virtual and in-person employment assistance.
- Services include career coaching, resume and cover letter assistance, interview preparation, virtual job fairs, training webinars, and Unemployment Insurance application assistance.

WIOA Adult/Dislocated Worker Program

Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA)



- Provides career and training services to unemployed or under-employed adult job seekers and assists workers who have been laid off or are about to be laid off.
- Universally accessible, customer centered, and training services are job-driven.
- Services include job search and placement assistance, labor market information, assessment of skills, follow-up services after employment and training services directly linked to job opportunities in in-demand industries and occupations.

WIOA Youth Program

Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA)



- Assists youth ages 17-24 with barriers to accessing employment and education opportunities
- Provides career development assistance, work experience, college and vocational school exploration, high school completion services, and paid training opportunities

SNAP E&T

Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program - Employment and Training

- Designed to assist SNAP recipients in their employment and training needs taking into consideration their interest, skills, and abilities, based on an individualized service plan.
- Participants are paired with an Employment
 Specialist to determine their goals and connects them to the related employment, training and educational services available.





VIEW Program

Virginia Initiative for Education and Work

- Supports the efforts of families receiving Temporary
 Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) to achieve
 independence through employment.
- Focuses on the participants' strengths and provides services to help them overcome job-related challenges, as well as personal, medical and family challenges that affect employment.

Bridges to Success




- Assists low-income job seekers with children with hidden disabilities.
- Comprised of a team of partners and service providers whose missions are to serve those with disabilities.
- Provides proper diagnosis, treatment and appropriate supportive services necessary to find and sustain employment.



SCSEP

Senior Community Service Employment Program



- For job seekers age 55 or older, currently unemployed, and meeting certain financial criteria.
- Participants receive a stipend while attending training, searching for a job, and build skills at a local non-profit organization.
- Job seekers can prepare for training site placements and employment from their home. Job readiness materials and online trainings are available for active participants.

Grants and Local Initiatives



- EYE (Educating Youth through Employment)
 Paid job readiness training and work experience for sponsored youth
- VITA (Volunteer Income Tax Assistance)
 Free tax preparation for individuals and families earning less then \$60,000 annually
