Mr. Hollingsworth reported that football starts practicing at the beginning of August. Preliminary registration numbers are positive, and football continues to work with official groups for the upcoming season. There is still a possibility football will have to schedule games on days not traditionally used because of the official's shortage.

Soccer

Ms. Bauer inquired if NCS, FCPS or FCPA would ever get involved in canceling field use due to extreme heat or air quality as opposed to leaving it up to the organizations to decide. Mr. Martino explained that FCPS has canceled use on FCPS property a couple of times due to the heat and poor air quality and NCS has relayed that information to the community. Mr. Martino stated that NCS will also contact FCPA, however in most cases, FCPA will not close the athletic fields and it is up to the group's discretion.

Volleyball

Mr. Baily reported he had a meeting with Dr. Reid to discuss the current situation regarding boys' volleyball. FCPS is not ready to make boys volleyball club sport yet, but Mr. Baily is putting information together to hopefully have it included in next year's budget.

Ms. Avvisato reported that NCS is working on finalizing everything for the 2023 Stephen A. McLaughlin Fairfax County Champions of Character.

Ms. Avvisato informed the Council that Ms. Bauer will launch the committee to discuss the proposed middle school after school sports program.

Ms. Avvisato explained the field allocation policy is a work in progress and NCS has a list of items they would like to look at and discuss.

Mr. Martino stated that fall 2023 field temporary permits for the major organizations have been sent out. Fall 2023 gym temporary permits for the major organizations will be sent out in mid-August.

Mr. Martino explained that the Falls Church High School, Oakton High School, and Woodson High School stadium fields are currently being resurfaced. When the stadium field resurfacing is completed at these locations, there is a possibility that the practice turf fields will be resurfaced which could cause significant scheduling issues. There is currently no plan in place, however Mr. Martino wanted to let the Council know of the possibility.
