MEETING OPENING

Mr. Hahne called the meeting to order at 7:31 p.m. Roll was called and a quorum was present.

ADMINISTRATIVE ITEMS

The September 20, 2017 minutes were approved.

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

Mr. Hahne opened a discussion regarding diversity in youth sports; How do we engage the different ethnic communities in youth sports at a younger age and what can we as a council do to facilitate this?

Mr. Sohn recommended giving guidance to the different ethnic communities on how to apply for a permit and what programs are currently available in the county.

Mr. Abbott discussed how Chantilly Youth Club holds a Hispanic night at Brookfield ES. Interpreters are available for parents and coaches to use. This has helped engage the Hispanic population in the western part of the county.

Mr. Flather recommended reaching out to the churches.

Mr. Leonard stated that the youth groups need to capture ethnicity data to see if we are reaching all the different ethnic communities and if not, what communities are being missed. This information will help the clubs and this council determine where we need to focus our education.

Ms. Willemssen recommended starting at the elementary school level to reach kids that don't play sports and get them engaged prior to high school. Mr. Flather explained that this is difficult due to FCPS rules regarding flyers being distributed in "backpack folder". He has had better luck developing relationships with the counselors and having them recommend the different sports programs offered in the area. Mr. Curran recommended communicating through the PTA/PTSA's. They are not under the same rules as the schools and have a separate web-site and newsletter that is sent home in the backpacks.

Mr Hahne is going to re-convene the steering committee and pull in Chris Pulley, Athletic Services Community Outreach Specialist, to help decided how we will proceed.



COMMITTEE REPORTS

Fairfax County Sports Tourism Task Force

Mr. Flather reported that the task force met on November 15th. Visit Fairfax gave a presentation identifying sports tourism models and opportunities.

The task force discussed potential tournament complex sites, Patriot Park North and Laurel Hills. Fairfax County does not have a large multi-field complex. Because of this there is a challenge balancing sports tourism and league sports using the current facilities. Supervisor Herrity is very interested in new development making it easier to block weekend use because there is not historical use by groups. The weekday use can be used for league play.

Mr. Leonard explained that Supervisor Herrity is looking at targeting Niche sports and making Fairfax county a "destination" location. Mr. Leonard stated that Athletic Services will begin capturing where teams are coming in from for tournaments.

Minutes from the September 14th and October 26th meetings were distributed. Moving forward all minutes and presentations will be emailed to the council.

MATTERS OF INTEREST FROM GOVERNING BODIES

Fairfax County Public Schools

Mr. Curran reported that the budget recommendations are in the final stages and will be moving forward. The superintendent is still committed to removing the activity fee. The standardize artificial turf maintenance program is moving forward. Fall sports are wrapping up.

The Stuart High School name change is progressing. The name will be changed to "Justice" High school. There is a push to have the change made by August 1, 2018.

Fairfax County Park Authority

Mr. Brown reported the Master plan will be sent to the Park Authority Board in December. Park Authority staff are currently working on a strategic plan to implement the master plan. Several Mastenbrook Grant applications have been submitted for field improvements.

Mr. Thompson explained that a plan has been brought forward by independent consultants to keep the rec centers competitive long term and revenue generating. This plan would require a \$200 million investment by the County and Park Authority for improvements and expansions to the rec centers. All the money would be spent in 5 years. Analysis show that if the investment is not made the rec centers will start running at a deficient. This matter has not been brought to the board at the time.

Neighborhood and Community Services

Mr. Martino reported that the fall season is wrapping up and the winter season is getting ready to start. Police and school security patrols will end on November 18th. If groups are still having issues, please have them contact NCS directly.

The new application system is up and running. Staff is still working through some glitches but most of the feedback from user groups has been positive.

NEW BUSINESS

Mr. Leonard reminded the council that Pat Harrison, Deputy County Executive, is retiring on January 19, 2018. He is recommending the Athletic Council recognize her dedication to the athletic community at the January 17, 2018 meeting with a plaque and refreshments.

Mr. Thompson further recommended naming a new Champions of Character award after Pat. He is going to put together a write up of the award and present it at the December meeting.



Mr. Thompson moved that we recognize Pat Harrison at the January 17, 2018 meeting. Ms. Pape seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Mr. Hahne reminded everyone that the December meeting was moved to December 13, 2017.

OLD BUSINESS

Mr. Thompson reminded the council that NCS and FCAC were being given the Harold L. Strickland Partnership and Collaboration Award at the 2017 Elly Doyle Park Service Awards. The ceremony will be November 17th at the Fair Oaks Waterford.
