CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

Mr. McLaughlin welcomed two new members to the Council. Mr. Roland Taylor is now the Town of Herndon alternate and Mr. Mark O'Meara is the Braddock District alternate.

Mr. McLaughlin reported that a meeting was scheduled with Jeff Platenberg on Monday March 25 per Chris Leonard regarding issues with Fairfax County Public Schools. If the meeting goes well, the proposed letter will not be sent to the Superintendent. Ms. Avvisato stated there were productive meetings between NCS and FCPS.

Ms. Garner and Mr. Hatcher talked through preliminary fixes to some of the concerns. Ms. Garner stated that there will be training dates in August for the public to attend regarding FCPS rules and regulations as well as how their registration system works. Regarding the Design and Construction matrix, the plan moving forward is to keep synthetic turf fields open during construction. The grid will also be updated to provide more accurate dates of projects. The FCPS community use office has also been reorganized for better communication and outreach.

Mr. Leonard stated his concern of the culture within the school system sliding back to where community use does not matter. Ms. Lowrey recommended that a letter or memo be created to memorialize the decisions and procedures that are put in place.

Mr. Taylor inquired what is the vision beyond where we stand right now as the population grows and needs change?



Ms. Pape Daniels brought up the need for the elected School Board member to be present at Athletic Council meetings. Mr. Curran stated that he has shared the concern up the chain.

SPORTS REPORT OUTS

Basketball

Mr. Bergstrom reported that they had a good season. He was pleased to share that fewer groups are being thrown out of gyms and there are fewer complaints from the schools of trash being left at facilities.

Ms. Bauer reported that spring field permits started March 1. She praised NCS for doing a good job controlling walk-ons.

MATTERS OF INTEREST FROM GOVERNING BODIES

<u>FCPS</u>

Mr. Curran reviewed the new VHSL District and Region realignment. With the new format, all Fairfax County schools are in 2 regions.

He also reported the winter season has been completed and it was a successful season.

Robinson SS hosted 3 classifications of the wrestling state tournament. While the event was a success, Mr. Curran informed the Council that Robinson SS is not big enough to host 3 classifications of wrestling moving forward.

Mr. Curran also shared with the Council that the Hayfield SS baseball field has been condemned due to standing water. Staff is still investigating the cause and any possible fixes to the field. In the meantime, Hayfield SS has moved all their baseball games to the turf diamond at South County MS.



<u>FCPA</u>

Mr. Brown reported that the following projects would be completed this summer.

- Nottoway Park 60 #5 turf replacement
- Lee District Park RF #4 turf replacement
- Nottoway Park 60 #1 turf renovation in partnership with Vienna Little League
- Rectangular field at Larry Graves Park in partnership with City of Falls Church
- South Run athletic field lights being replaced
- Alabama Drive Park replace athletic field lighting on diamond fields and replace irrigation on diamonds and rectangle field

The park near Justice HS has been renamed Justice Park and the new signage has been posted.

Mr. Brown also urged the Council to get the word out regarding trash being left on athletic fields. He indicated that FCPA staff spends 20% of its time picking up trash when that time could be devoted to field prepping.

<u>NCS</u>

Ms. Avvisato praised the success of the Mental Health Symposium. She stated that this is just the first step and the conversation regarding mental health needs to keep going.

Mr. Martino reminded the Council that Police and School Security should be present at designated "hot spots" to prevent conflicts and walk-ons. He urged the Council to contact him if they are having any issues at a site.

Mr. Martino reminded the Council that if groups are not using space this spring to please let NCS know so staff can re-allocate space to those requests that have no space.
