FCPS

Mr. Martino informed the Council that Dr. Ricardy Anderson has been appointed to the Council as the new School Board member. Mr. Chapman reported that his office and NCS are working together to finalize field and gym usage schedules at the schools. Mr. Chapman also informed the Council that there was an initiative to retain custodians and building supervisors to prevent turnover. In closing, Mr. Chapman reminded the Council to be aware of potential inclement weather. FCPS is making every effort to make the call on closing facilities as early as possible. The most reliable source to find out of potential closings is the FCPS website.

FCPA

Mr. Sutherland reported that there are no changes to the current scheduled projects (included in October meeting notes). Mr. Sutherland was pleased to report that FCPA had started routine maintenance of all the FCPS synthetic turf fields.

NCS

Mr. Martino informed the Council that he attended the high school Director of Student Activities meeting to discuss green days, off-site practices and late practice times. One of the issues impacting the late practice times is coaches who do not work at the school. Unfortunately, it does not look like it is an issue that will be going away. Mr. Martino encouraged the Council to develop working relationships with the schools to avoid as many conflicts as possible.

The Council stressed that there needs to be a solution to the issues that include late cancellations, green days conflicting with community use and other communication breakdowns. The Council recommended putting a committee together to discuss the issues and develop creative solutions. Mr. Meana stated that staff at schools change regularly, however, there needs to be ongoing communication between FCPS and the community. One suggestion includes mandated meetings between user groups and schools. Mr. Meana also reminded the Council that each area of the County is unique and solutions that work in one area of the County may not work in another. The main point the Council stressed is communication!
