# **MEETING OPENING**

Mr. McLaughlin called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. Roll was called, and a quorum was present. Ms. Avvisato introduced Lloyd Tucker who was appointed the new Director of Neighborhood and Community Services.

# PRESENTATIONS TO COUNCIL

Neighborhood and Community Services staff gave a presentation on the NCS Scholarship Program. The PowerPoint from the presentation can be accessed at NCS Scholarship Presentation.

A motion was presented to send a letter to the Board of Supervisors requesting additional funds for the scholarship program. The motion was seconded and approved without objection.

Ms. Avvisato stated that NCS would like to reconvene the sports scholarship committee to review the scholarship program.

# **COMMITTEE REPORTS**

Mr. Martino stated that the Best Practices for Sports Organizations had finalized the membership and will look to convene soon.

# REPORTS BY SPORTS REPRESENTATIVES

#### Baseball

Mr. Hahne thanked Mr. Curran and Mr. Martino for working with the baseball and softball communities regarding high school diamond field opening dates.

Mr. Hahne reported Mr. Curran and several high school baseball and softball coaches worked together on making recommendations for high school return to play protocols.

## Basketball

Mr. Bergstrom reported that the winter basketball season ended last week. There were three types of organizations that ran during the winter: Recreational leagues, Fairfax County Youth Basketball League (FCYBL) and the St. James. Everything went smoothly during the winter all things considered. Enrollment was at roughly 40% of normal. All COVID-19 polices mimicked the Virginia High School League (VHSL) polices and guidelines.

# Fast Pitch Softball

Ms. Willemssen thanked Mr. Curran for helping with the high school softball field opening dates. Ms. Willemssen explained the softball community would be pushing for reforms on current polices that include grass field opening and closure dates.



#### Football

Mr. Meana reported that the high school football season has completed half their schedule and the community is enjoying the season immensely.

#### Lacrosse

Ms. Wagner reported that the Northern Virginia Youth Lacrosse League (NVYLL) is ready to start the spring season. Ms. Wagner informed the Council that NVYLL has 25 member clubs across multiple counties and that each club has its own COVID-19 policies. Some clubs require masks while playing while others do not. There are also different policies on spectators.

## Soccer

Ms. Bauer was happy to report that there have been minimal issues in the soccer community. Parents and youth are grateful to be able to participate in soccer and are relieved and appreciative of the COVID-19 guidelines and protocols that have been put in place to ensure everyone's safety. The spring soccer season starts shortly.

# **Volleyball**

Mr. Pruitt reported that preparations are being made for the spring indoor volleyball season. Most clubs are participating; however, there has been reduced participation and resources. Mr. Pruitt explained the lack of FCPS gym space has been challenging and impactful.

#### STATUS REPORT FROM COUNTY REPRESENTATIVES

## **FCPS**

Mr. Curran reported the high school winter sports season was completed. Centreville HS boys' basketball and Madison HS girls' basketball won state championships. Robinson SS wrestling was state champion. For indoor track South Lakes HS boys won the state championship and Robinson SS girls were state runner-up. Mr. Curran stated it is a major accomplishment to have completed a winter season.

Mr. Curran stated that the high school fall sports season is underway. Football is roughly 2/3 complete and all other fall sports seasons are halfway complete. There have been positive COVID-19 cases here and there, but FCPS is managing them and working closely with the Health Department.

Mr. Curran explained FCPS is also preparing for the spring high school sports season which starts on April 12 and runs through the end of June. One factor that is being discussed now is what to do when the spring season ends. It would be a quick turnaround to end spring sports at the end of June and start practices for fall sports in August.

#### **FCPA**

Mr. Louis reported the Park Authority is taking advantage of the good weather and getting the grass fields ready for the spring season.

Mr. Thompson reported that the Patriot Park North baseball complex is still on track to be completed in roughly 2 years.

## NCS

Ms. Avvisato praised all the youth groups for putting guidelines and protocols in place to be able to conduct a winter gym season. Groups are doing a great job reporting positive COVID-19 cases and quarantining players/teams when necessary. Ms. Avvisato explained that the groups have a responsibility to follow the CDC and local health officials' guidelines, which includes assisting the Health Department with contact tracing. NCS understands the anxiety of group's providing participant information; however, this information is necessary for the Health Department to complete its contact tracing. NCS and the Health Department will be conducting a virtual meeting to engage with the athletic community and alleviate any concerns citizens may have and answer questions.

Mr. Martino reminded the Council that since the high school spring sports season starts on April 12, some permit times may change. Mr. Martino encouraged all groups double check their permit times after April 12.



Mr. Martino informed the Council that Police and School Security would start patrolling at specific sites the first week of April to help with walk-on issues.
