MEETING OPENING

Ms. Bauer called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. Roll was called, and a quorum was present.

CITIZENS TO ADDRESS COUNCIL

PRESENTATIONS TO COUNCIL

Ms. Bauer reviewed the Virginia FOIA requirements and remote participation policy with the Council.

The Council discussed some of the circumstances in the remote participation policy and sought clarification on some of the items.

Mr. Thompson moved that the Council adopt the remote participation policy. Mr. Sohn seconded the motion and the motion passed unanimously.

Mr. Thompson proposed an amendment to the Council by-laws under Article IV – Meetings and adding the following as Section 5: Remote Participation

Allows electronic participation by a member when a quorum of the Council is physically assembled under certain circumstances:

- A member's disability or other medical condition prevents their physical attendance (no limit to # of meetings)
- A member's family member has a medical condition that requires the member's care (no limit to # of meetings)
- A BAC member's principal residence is over 60 miles away from the meeting location (no limit to # of meetings)
- A personal matter (limited to two or 25% of meetings, whichever is greater)

The Council may hold all-virtual meetings two times or 25% of meetings per calendar year (whichever is greater). All-virtual meetings cannot be held in consecutive months.

CHAIRMAN REPORT

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Communications with Fairfax County Partners - FCPS, FCPA, NCS and Community Users Mr. Flather explained that he had requested the fall 2022 cancelation data from NCS. Mr. Flather requested that NCS and FCPS staff put together a presentation to share with the Council at a future meeting of the cancelation data analysis. Mr. Flather stated that good steps have been made to improve the cancelations, however there are still many events that are known well in advance that are not being entered before community use permits are issued. The Council is interested in seeing the cancelation data and what types of

events are causing the cancelations. NCS and FCPS will work together on a presentation of the cancellation data.

APRT

Ms. Avvisato reported the team is finalizing the APRT report and will provide a presentation to the Council at either the December or January Council meeting.

Stephen A. McLaughlin Champions of Character

Mr. Martino stated that the ceremony will take place in October 2023. NCS staff is securing the date based on the availability of the Government Center complex. Mr. Martino urged the Council to help with getting nominations.

Sports Scholarship Program

Ms. Avvisato stated that the Sports Scholarship committee will reconvene after the APRT report is finalized and complete.

REPORTS BY SPORTS REPRESENTATIVES

Basketball

Mr. Bergstrom reported that the basketball council recently met and one of the goals was to report on the status of basketball in general. The impetus for this effort was a decline in girls basketball participation. Mr. Bergstrom thanked NCS for providing participation data for the last several years. Mr. Bergstrom explained the basketball council has been in discussion about the decline in girls' basketball participation during the pandemic and had hoped it would rebound. Mr. Bergstrom reported that some high schools in Prince William County were having issues forming girls' basketball teams. Lake Braddock Secondary School first-year girls' basketball team may not be able to form a team as well. Mr. Bergstrom and the basketball council is going to review the participation data and have discussions with several clubs to determine the cause in declining participation.

Fast Pitch Softball

Ms. Willemssen reported that Mr. Hahne and herself would be meeting about the new Patriot Park North complex. Ms. Willemssen was pleased to announce that USA Softball had reached out and will be hosting two events in Fairfax County in the spring. Ms. Willemssen thanked Ms. Avvisato and NCS on behalf of the softball community for their dedicated work on the APRT report.

Footbal

Mr. Hollingsworth stated that the Fairfax County Youth Football League season has concluded, and participation was up 14%.

Soccer

Ms. Bauer and Ms. Moxie informed the Council there have been many reports of vandalism throughout the County. Ms. Bauer and Ms. Moxie also stated that walk-on groups have been active and conducting illegal activity such as having food trucks without proper permits, drinking alcohol, etc. The soccer council is going to send a form to members to ask them to what extent they have experienced issues this season.

Volleyball

Mr. Baily reported the high school volleyball season is wrapping up. Boys' recreation leagues have completed, and kids are looking for other opportunities of what they can do during the winter other than club volleyball. Club volleyball try-outs for girls will take place after the high school season is completed. Mr. Baily was pleased to announce that there were thirty-five high school club boys' volleyball teams this fall. They continue to work with Mr. Curran on getting boys volleyball recognized as an official VHSL sport.

STATUS REPORT FROM COUNTY REPRESENTATIVES

FCPS

Mr. Curran informed the Council that the high school fall season is wrapping up. There was some concern about weather last Friday, but the high school football games were able to play with no issue. Mr. Curran was pleased to announce Fairfax High School won the VHSL field hockey state championship, as well as the Woodson High School boys and West Springfield High School girls cross country teams.

High schools are now in the second week of the winter season with try outs being completed and scrimmages being played. Mr. Curran reported that VHSL has approved girls wrestling as an emerging sport. Fairfax County high school wrestling teams have been a coed sport; however, this would create a separate state championship for female wrestlers.

Middle School Sports

Mr. Curran explained that FCPS has collaborated closely with middle school after-school specialists to develop athletic programming that falls within the middle school after-school program so that it does not need additional resources or funding but does provide intramural or inter-scholastic competition that is inclusive. Middle school principals have approved, and the proposal has been sent to FCPS leadership for approval this winter.

Council members inquired if there would be any impact on community use time. Mr. Curran stated that all the events would fall within the middle school after-school program time and would not affect community use.

The Council inquired what sports would be included. Mr. Curran explained that there would be basketball in the winter and soccer and track in the spring.

Mr. Flather inquired who would be coaching or instructing these teams. Mr. Curran indicated the middle school after-school specialists will support that piece, however in the future they are hoping to offset the high school seasons to allow for high school coaches to participate.

Mr. Flather asked how the track teams would operate without a track at most middle schools. Mr. Curran explained track practices would be at the middle schools themselves with fields already available and any track meets would be coordinated with the high schools to use the track during Saturday morning time designated for high school practices.

High School Coaching- Shortages, Funding, Issues

Mr. Curran reported that there is a shortage of high school coaches nationwide. FCPS established a committee of high school coaches, the coach advisory committee. The committee's goal is to find out what the high school coaches enjoy, what they do not, and how those issues can be addressed. One factor is there is also a teacher shortage which used to make up a large amount of the high school coaches. FCPS has a recruitment team that attend college job fairs. The Director of Student Activities (DSA) Association has a presence at all mentoring and Great Beginning sessions. FCPS is reaching out to local schools and talking to them about athletes who are finishing that are interested in going into education or otherwise remain in the area and coach outside of teaching to continue that piece of it.

FCPS has moved to the 3 Dimension Institute for coaches and principal course. One of the major points under the coaching education system programming is it provides coaches a platform to overcome some of the frustrations that you see as a coach. It gives them tools to manage challenging parents or administration. It goes much deeper into what you are doing and why you are doing it.

FCPS continues to speak with colleagues at the state and national level to see how coaches can be recruited, retained, and supported.

Mr. Curran recommended the Council formally invite new FCPS Superintendent, Dr. Michelle C. Reid to a future Council meeting.

NCS

Ms. Avvisato reported NCS staff has been working on the APRT report. Ms. Avvisato informed the Council that FCPS and NCS staff continue to work together on improving processes and communication around the cancelations.

Mr. Martino reminded the Council that FCPS gyms are unavailable November 23-25 for Thanksgiving, however the weekend of November 26-27 is available. Mr. Martino urged groups that do not plan to use weekend gym space on November 26-27 to please let NCS know so they can remove the scheduled use from the calendar and let FCPS know.
