#### **MEETING OPENING**

Ms. Bauer called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. Roll was called, and a quorum was present.

#### PRESENTATIONS TO COUNCIL

Ms. Willemssen gave a presentation on the updated Girls Fastpitch Softball Action Plan Review Team (APRT) report. A link to the PowerPoint presentation can be found at <u>girls</u> fastpitch softball action plan review team (aprt).pdf (fairfaxcounty.gov)

The Council had discussion and praised the team for their work on the report. Ms. Bauer moved that the Fairfax County Athletic Council support all recommendations in the APRT report. Ms. Pape Daniels seconded the motion and it passed without objection.

#### **ADMINISTRATIVE ITEMS**

The meeting minutes from the virtual meeting on November 16 were approved

#### **CHAIRMAN REPORT**

Ms. Bauer reminded the Council about the Virginia FOIA requirements discussed at the November 16 Council meeting. The state of emergency in Fairfax County has not been lifted, but once it is all Boards, Authorities and Commissions will have 3 months to get everything in order to go back to in-person meetings.

#### **COMMITTEE REPORTS**

Communications with Fairfax County Partners - FCPS, FCPA, NCS and Community Users Mr. Flather thanked Ms. Avvisato for pulling a meeting together with other committee members along with Mr. Hatcher and Ms. Garner from FCPS Community Use. Mr. Flather stated that he had introduced a letter several months ago and took feedback and redrafted the letter to go to the School Board and BOS. Mr. Flather explained that the letter includes improved communication between FCPS and NCS staff. The late cancelations after permits are issues continues to be an issue. The letter states that the issue is beyond the FCPS Community Use office to fix because they are bound by FCPS regulations. Mr. Flather explained the letter contains an ask for an MOU to handle late school events and how the schools and community can work together to solve conflicts. Mr. Tucker will review the letter and Mr. Flather will share the letter with the Council once it is approved.

#### Stephen A. McLaughlin Champions of Character

Mr. Martino reminded the Council that the 2023 Stephen A. McLaughlin Champions of Character ceremony is in-person this year and will take place on October 17. NCS staff met with the communications team and is in the process of putting together a Save the Date announcement. Mr. Martino urged the Council to reach out to the community to get nominations. There was a discussion about which seasons should be included for nominees. The Champions of Character committee will meet to clarify which seasons should be included for nominees and will let the Council know.

#### REPORTS BY SPORTS REPRESENTATIVES

#### Baseball

Mr. Hahne reported that he and Mr. Flather are meeting about the Patriot Park North complex. Mr. Hahne encouraged the Council to take a look at the site if they have time.

#### Fast Pitch Softball

Ms. Willemssen reported that the softball council had a meeting on Sunday. All the organizations reported an increase in participation. The softball council is pleased with the developments with the APRT and look forward to seeing the final report. Ms. Willemssen stated that the softball community continues to work with the Park Authority about how baseball and softball differ and how they can help support softball tournaments.

#### Soccer

Ms. Bauer reported walk-on use has been occurring throughout the County. Several groups have reported vandalism of equipment such as cutting nets. The walk-on groups have also located the light boxes at several locations and are turning off the lights on permitted groups. The soccer council sent a survey to all the members asking about issues they have experienced. Ms. Bauer will pass along the results from the survey to FCPA and NCS.

#### Volleyball

Ms. Swope reported that the volleyball council will be meeting in mid-to-late February. The club season and tournaments are currently in progress. The volleyball council continues to work with Mr. Curran to make boys volleyball a club sports at the high school level.

#### STATUS REPORT FROM COUNTY REPRESENTATIVES

#### **FCPS**

Mr. Curran reported that approximately \$650,000 was included in the budget for middle school sports. It is well defined in the budget as cross country occurring in the fall and track in the spring. Mr. Curran reminded the Council that the budget process is a long process and there is no guarantee the item will make it to the final budget. However, the middle school sports program has been well received by School Board members. Mr. Curran explained that coordination will happen with the middle school principals and after-school specialists. The plan is for the cross country meets and practices to be held at the middle schools themselves. The track meets in the spring will occur on Saturday mornings at local high schools during the designated high school practice time.

Mr. Meana proposed that the Council appoint a subcommittee for middle school sports with members from FCPS and the Council. Alternatively, if FCPS has an advisory committee on middle school sports, Council members should be part of that group. The program is in the preliminary stages, however if the program is looking to expand to other sports, there needs to be discussion amongst all parties.

Mr. Tucker informed the Council that Ms. Keisha Dotson was recently promoted to a Deputy Director in NCS. NCS has grown exponentially over the last few years and now includes Adult Day Health Centers as well as parts of our Office for Strategy Management. In FY2019 NCS added Office for Children which houses SACC, Head Start and multiple school readiness facets of support for our early childhood education.

Mr. Martino informed the Council there will be a general user group meeting with NCS, FCPS and FCPA on February 22. The meeting will be virtual.
