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Is Bridges to Success right for me?

Our focus is on your well-being. We provide supportive services to those who are looking for work and want a better life for themselves and their families. Our goal is to help you get to a place where you feel better and are able to move closer to reaching your life goals. Information shared is confidential and judgement-free.

What are the requirements?

The Bridges to Success program is about choice. As a program participant, you will receive recommendations from professionals on how to overcome challenges in your life. Based on those recommendations, you decide on what path to take. We all have a common goal-we want you to feel better and to help you meet your employment and family needs. How we get there is up to you.

How can Bridges to Success help me?

We promote self-care, but what that looks like is up to you. As a participant, you would have the opportunity to talk with professionals (job coaches, therapists, life coaches, etc.) on how to handle a problem or issue standing in the way of your success. How we move forward with their advice is your choice.

What will happen to my benefits?

The Bridges to Success program **does not affect your public assistance** (SSI, SSDI, TANF, SNAP, etc.). Best of all, **services are FREE** to all who join!

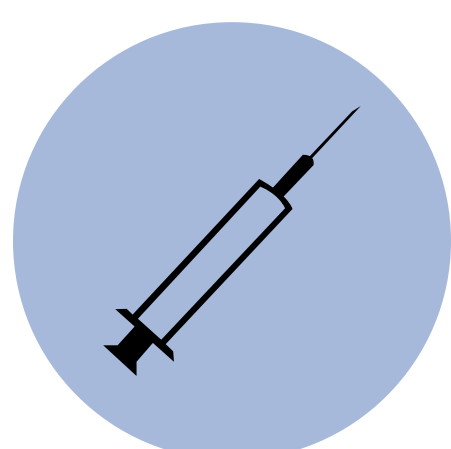

If you answered yes to any of the above questions, the SNAP Employment and Training Program (SNAPET) may be right for you.

SNAPET offers support for:

- ✓ Vocational training for in-demand occupations.
- ✓ GED and high school completion.

- ✓ Additional supportive services, such as transportation or employer required work uniforms.

Once you are approved for TANF and have no exemptions, you will be contacted by VIEW within 10 days to meet with a case manager.

Please note that you **must meet with a VIEW case manager within 30 days of TANF approval** to continue to receive your TANF benefits.

VIEW Success Story:

Jane was a single mom of two young children with a GED and limited work experience. She was interested in pursuing a career in healthcare but she feared her past struggles with focusing and retaining information would hold her back. Her VIEW worker suggested she complete a job assessment and worked with her to review the results which indicated that healthcare would be a good fit! Excited with the news, Jane knew she needed to work on overcoming some of her past challenges. She was referred to the Bridges to Success program and began working with a job coach to develop strategies for remaining focused in training and work. Jane also used VIEW training funds to enroll in a Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA) program. With accommodations for testing, she was able to pass the class and receive her license. Jane is now working as a CNA for a home health care agency earning \$12 an hour and working on becoming a Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN).





What is the VIEW program?

The VIEW program provides employment, training, and support services to those receiving TANF.

TANF recipients without an exemption are required to participate in the VIEW program.

Available services include:

- ✓ Job readiness skills.
- ✓ Child care assistance.
- ✓ Transportation assistance.
- ✓ ESOL classes.
- ✓ Access to counseling.
- ✓ Educational assistance (GED).
- ✓ Certification training.
- ✓ Additional referrals.


Note: Services are dependent on meeting program requirements and availability of funds.



**Is VIEW
for me?**

VIEW is not for everyone. You may be exempt if:

- ✓ You have a child under 12 months.
- ✓ You are 60 years or older.
- ✓ You have a medical condition that prevents you from participating in a work activity.
- ✓ You are receiving SSA disability benefits.
- ✓ You are providing full time care for a family member with a disability.

As a VIEW participant, what do I need to do?

All VIEW participants are required to participate in:

- 30 hours of work each week, or;
- 35 hours of work activities each week. Activities may include job search, training, volunteering, and ESOL classes.
