


# What are Opioids? Opioids are a potentially addictive group of drugs used to reduce pain Opioids include: Prescription pain medications such as oxycodone (OxyContin, Percocet), hydrocodone (Vicodin), codeine, morphine, and others Heroin Fentanyl (potent synthetic opioid)





**ACEs** – Presentation to help understand the impacts of childhood adversity and trauma on development and how to build resiliency and improve well-being.



**QPR (Question, Persuade, Refer)** - is a suicide prevention program where participants learn to recognize the warning signs of a suicide crisis and how to question, persuade, and refer someone to help.

**Talk They Hear You** – Empowers parents and caregivers to talk with children and teens about drugs and alcohol. Understand the risks and triggers of underage substance use and drinking and how to play a role in prevention

# FAIRFAXCOUNTY Additional FCPS Measures All FCPS students K-10 received substance use prevention and education instruction through their health and physical education curriculum. 11th and 12 graders receive substance use prevention and education lessons through their advisory periods. 

- ✓ May be a recent onset or going on for some time.




# **Parent Support Groups**







- "Heads Up" Teens between the ages of 14-17 who are working through emotional, mental health or substance use challenges.

  - Financial Occupational Emotional Environmental

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


