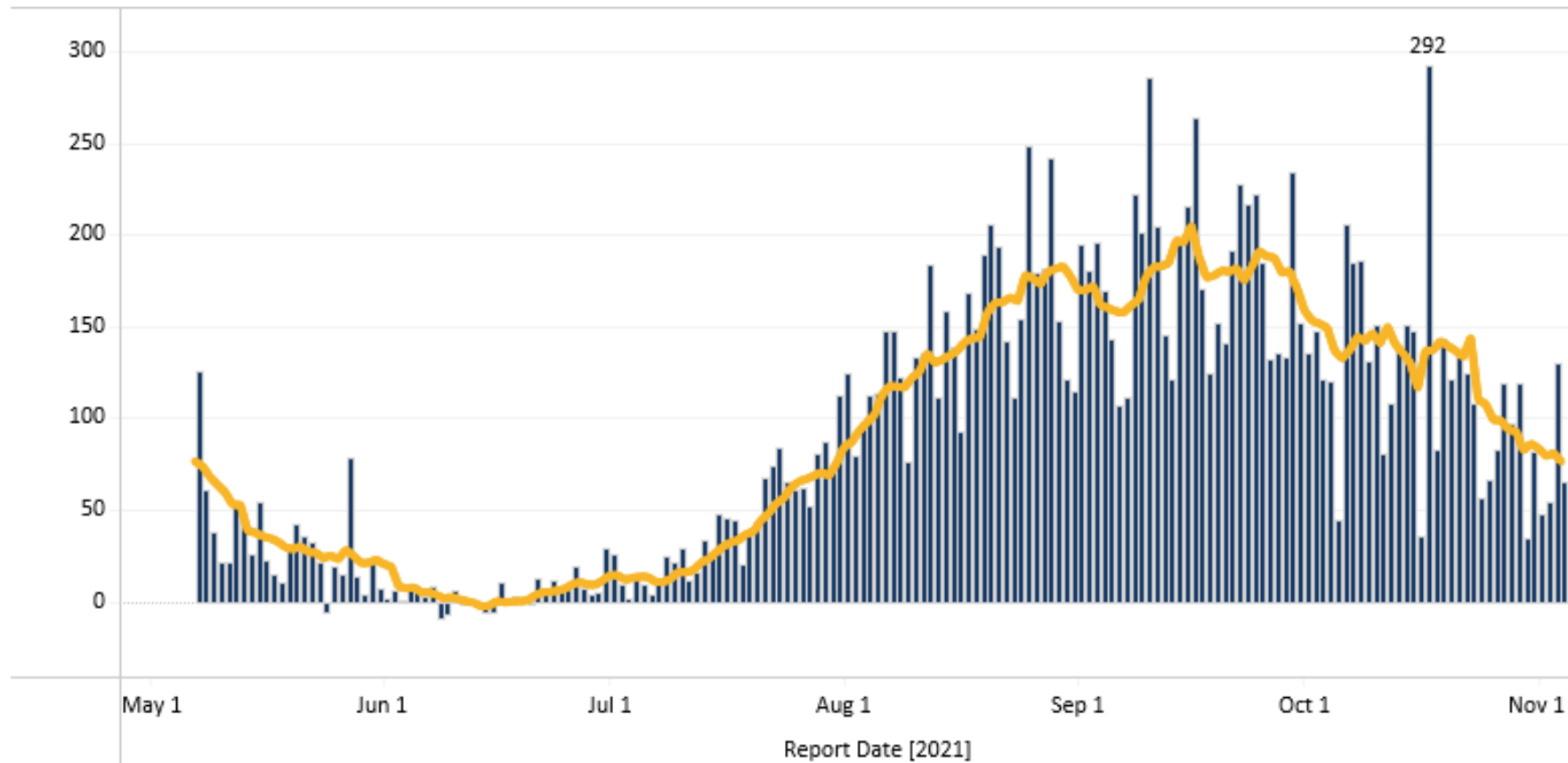

COVID-19 Cases in Fairfax County: “Delta Surge”

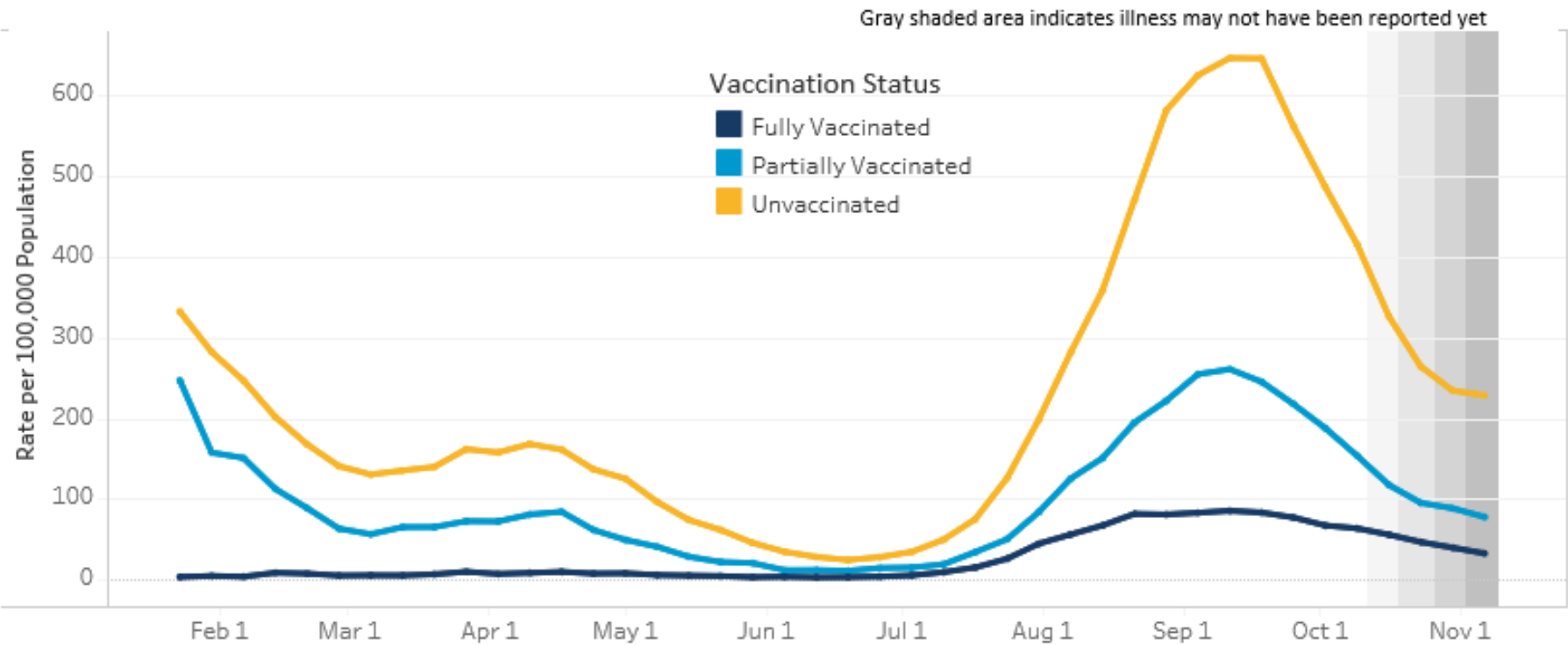

Disease and Vaccination Status

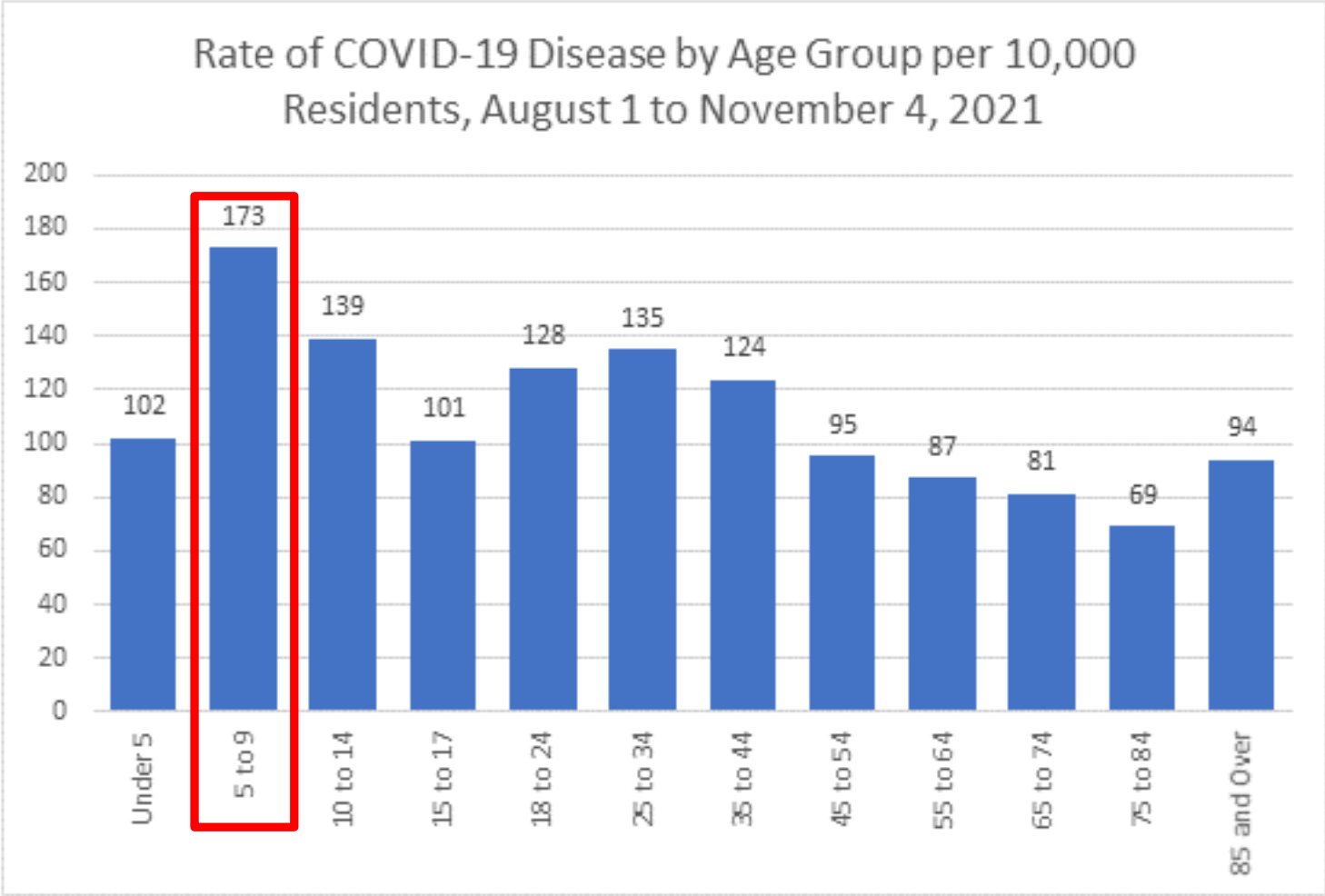
During the week ending 11/6/2021, unvaccinated people developed COVID-19 at a rate **7.0 times** that of fully vaccinated people and **2.9 times** that of partially vaccinated people.‡



Holiday Guidance – Layered Prevention Strategies

- Substantial Regional Transmission
- Maintain Vigilance
 - Vaccination
 - Face covers/Masks when indoors
 - Stay Home When Sick
 - Social Distance
 - Avoid Crowded and Indoor Areas
 - Testing, Isolation and Quarantine
 - Wash Hands/Hand Sanitizer
 - Post travel testing if not fully vaccinated

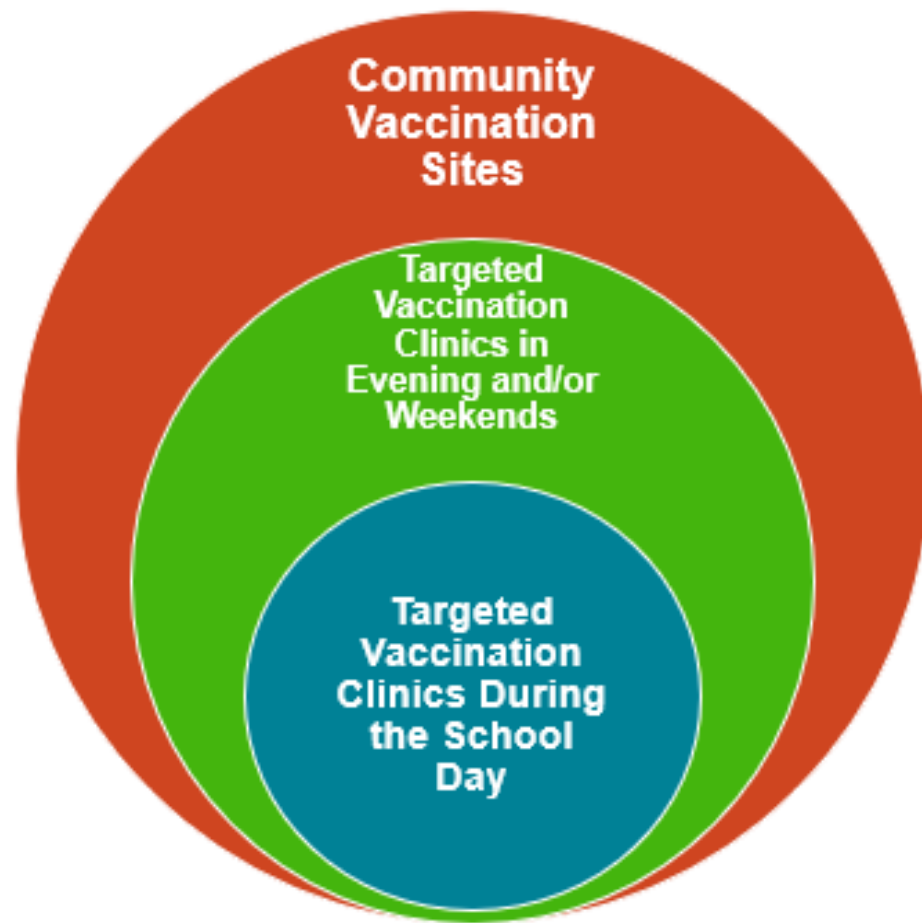
Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 Vaccine Immunogenicity, Efficacy & Safety



- The vaccine product is a different formulation with 1/3 the adult dose (orange cap).
- Antibody levels for 5-11 year olds comparable to 16-25 year olds
- Efficacy 91% in clinical trials
- No serious adverse events occurred related to vaccination
- Vaccine reactions (local pain, fever, headache, fatigue, muscle pain) occurred, more often after dose 2
- Based on benefits of vaccination versus potential risks, ACIP unanimously recommended vaccination of 5-11 year olds

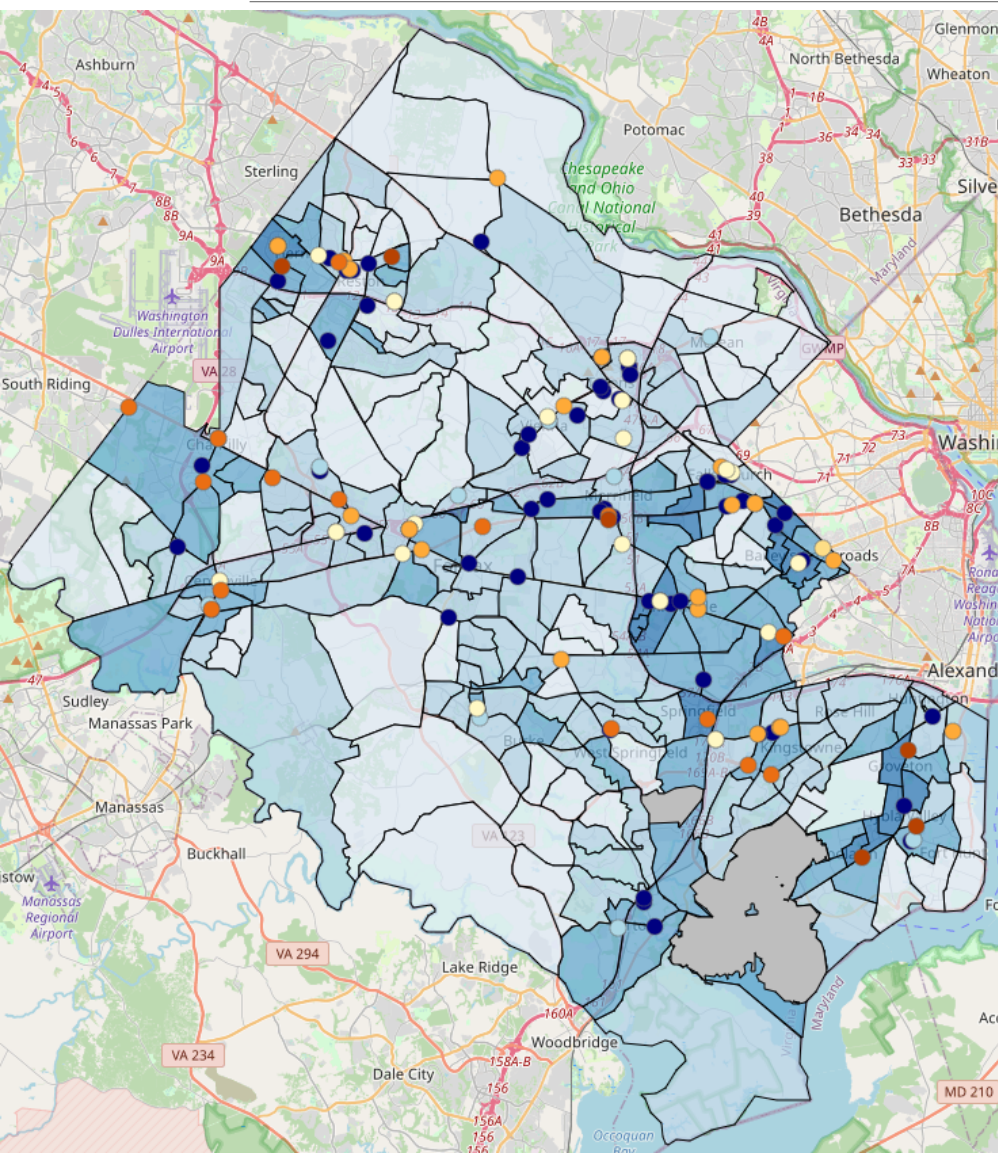


Fairfax County 5-11 Year Old Vaccination Implementation Plan



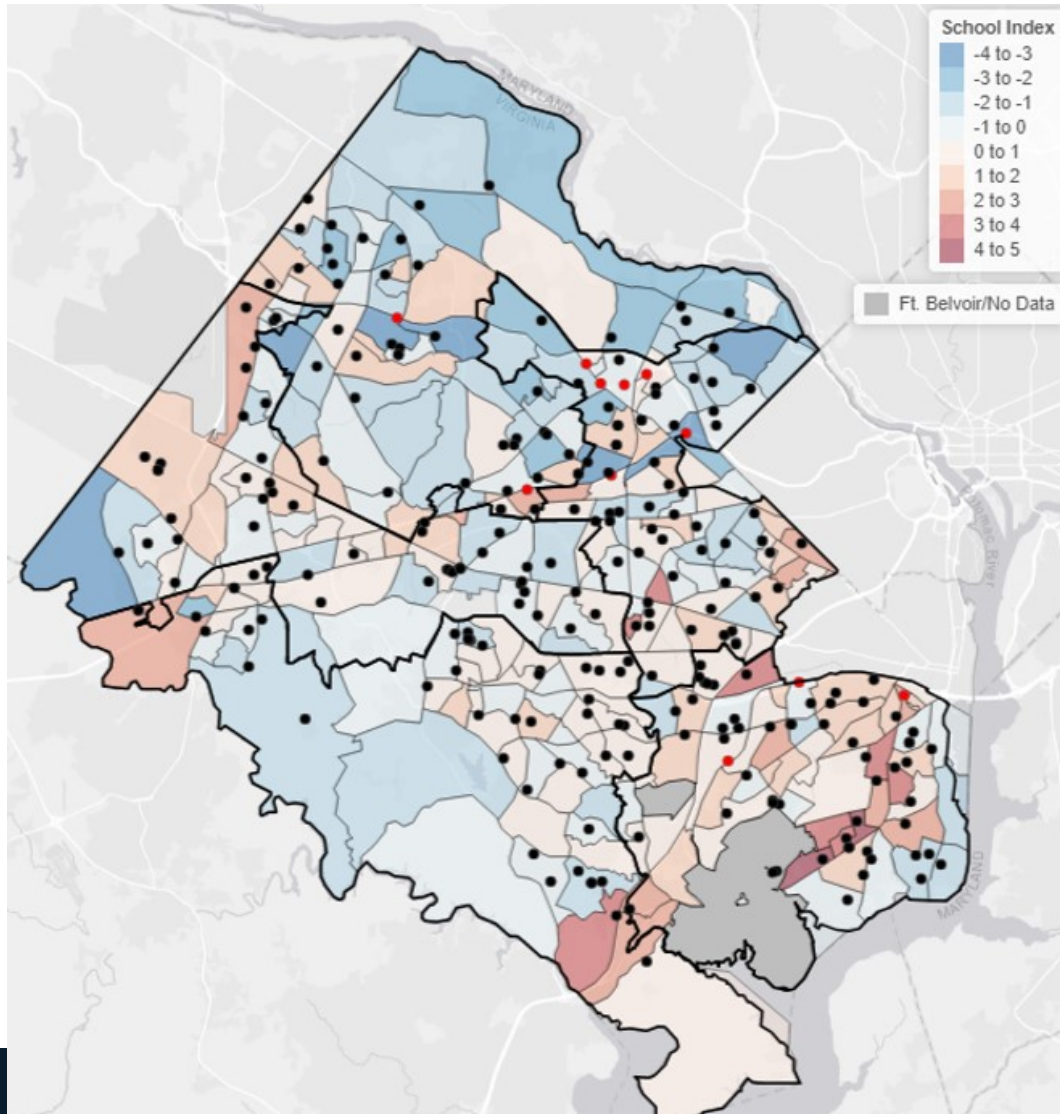

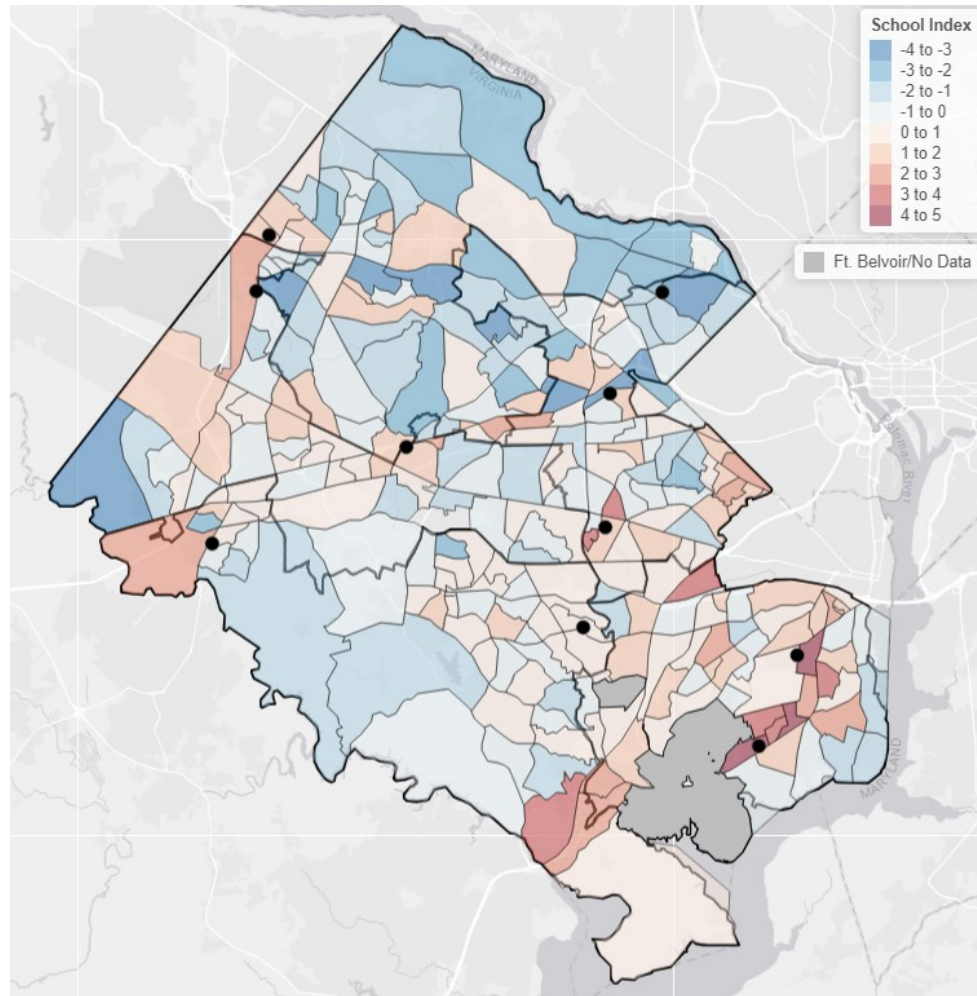

School Selection for Weekend/After Hour Clinics



- Site selection a collaboration of FCPS & FCHD
- Health Department recommendations based on:
 - Index of social vulnerability, low vaccination rate, and higher population
 - Geographic balance
 - Accessibility
- Vaccinations delivered by a VDH contracted pharmacy or FCHD Field Vaccination Team

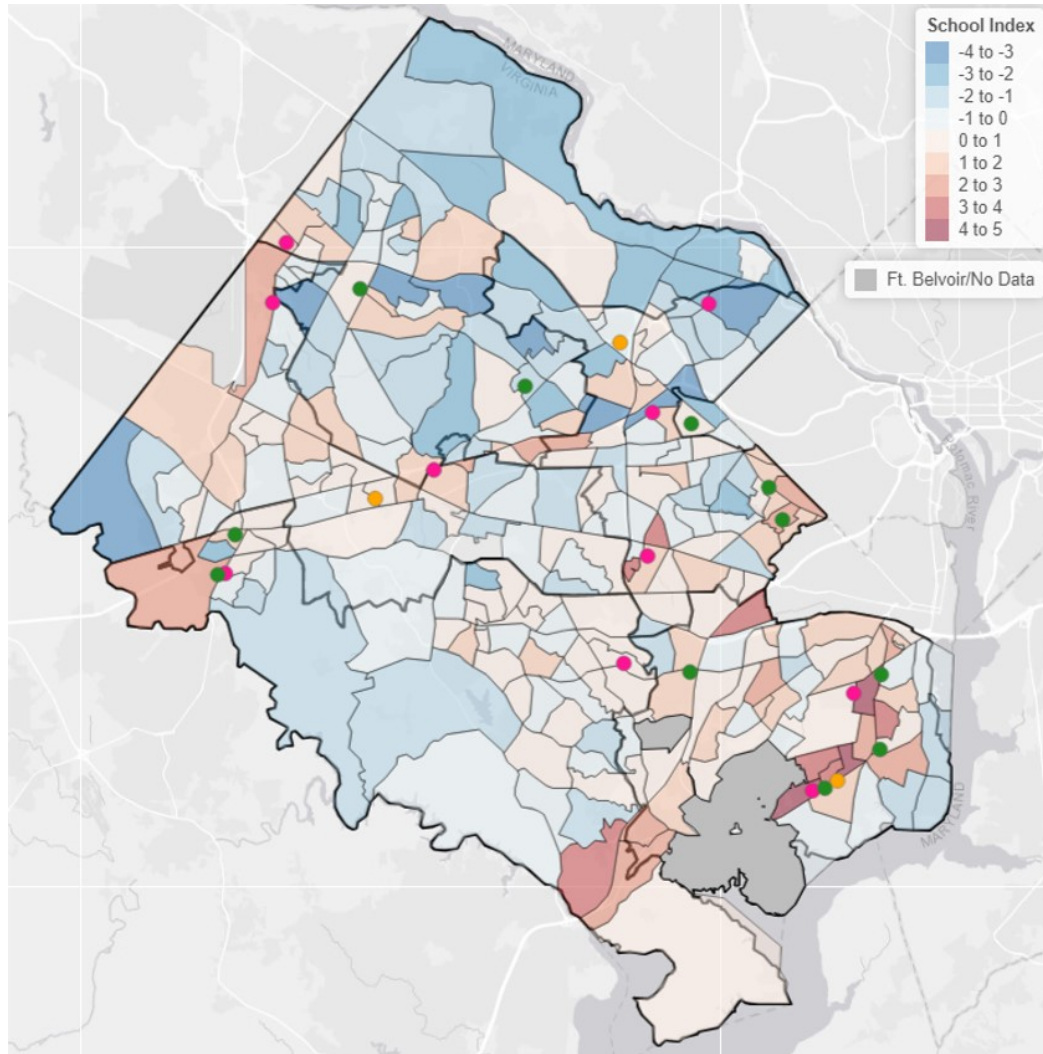


Vaccine Navigation

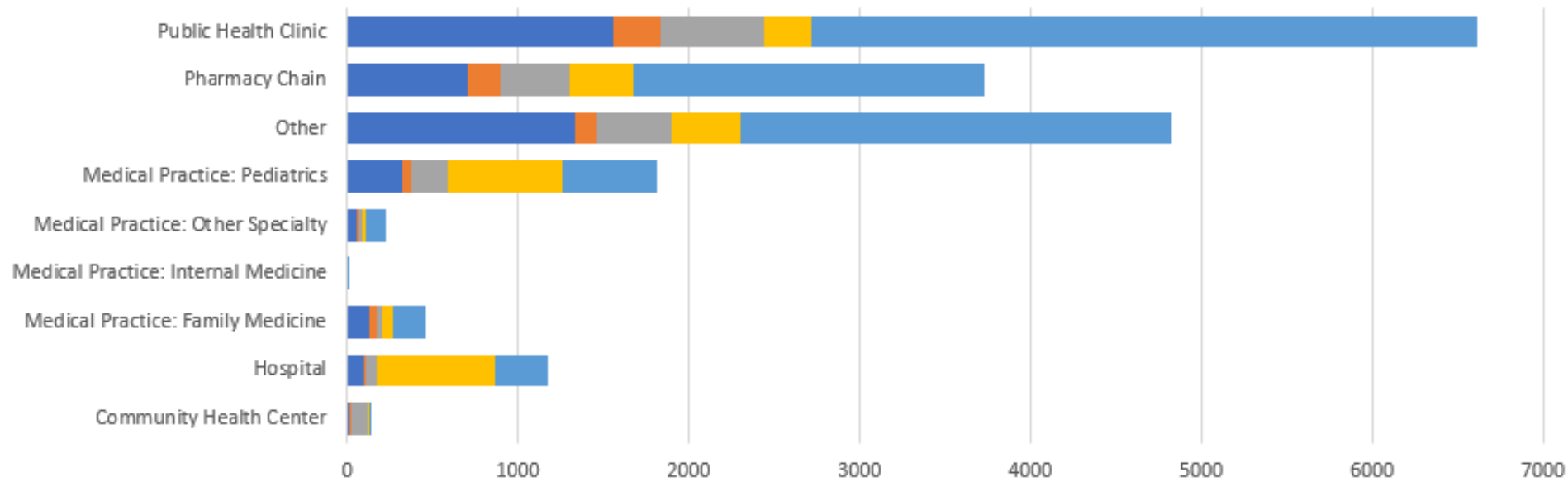

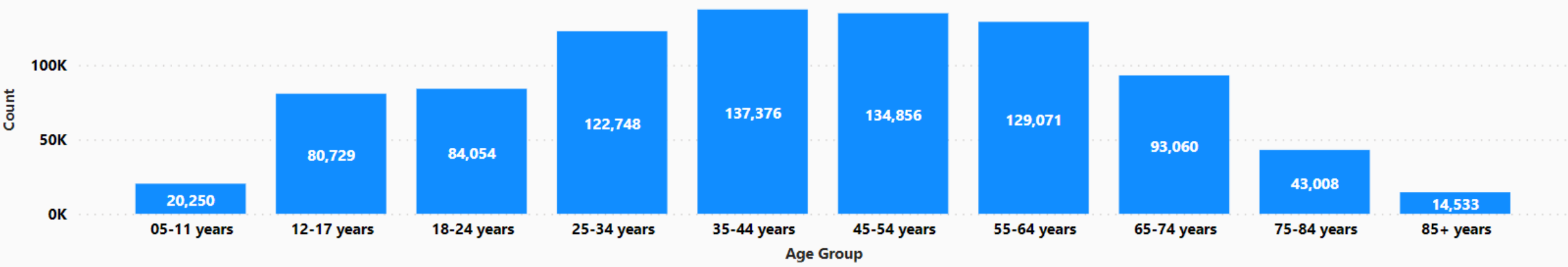


Fairfax Health District *COVID-19 Vaccination by Age Group*

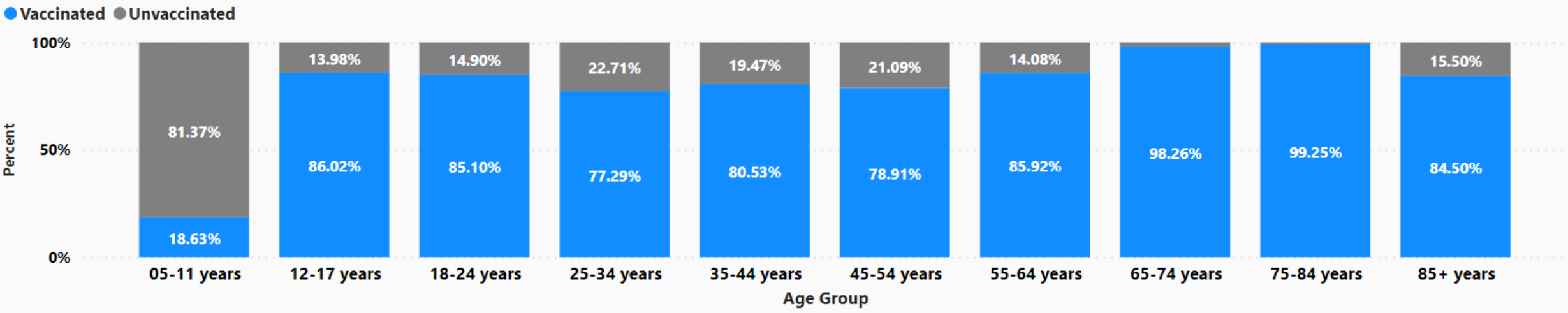

Vaccination rates for school-aged children



VDH dashboard for Fairfax as of 11/17/21

- Ages 5-11: 22% one dose
- Ages 12-15: 85.86% one dose, 76% fully vaccinated, .1% booster/third dose
- Ages 16-17: 91.7% one dose, 84% fully vaccinated, .4% booster/third dose

Parental Attitudes and Intent for Vaccination of 5-11 Year Olds

- FCPS survey
 - Survey sent to 85,302 parents; 36% response rate
 - 78% report intent to vaccinate their child (80% of them immediately)
 - 12% undecided and 10% plan not to vaccinate
 - Preference was to vaccinate with their doctor
 - Most concerns are related to long term side effects, including myocarditis
 - Limitations – low response rate & lower proportion of African American and Hispanic respondents

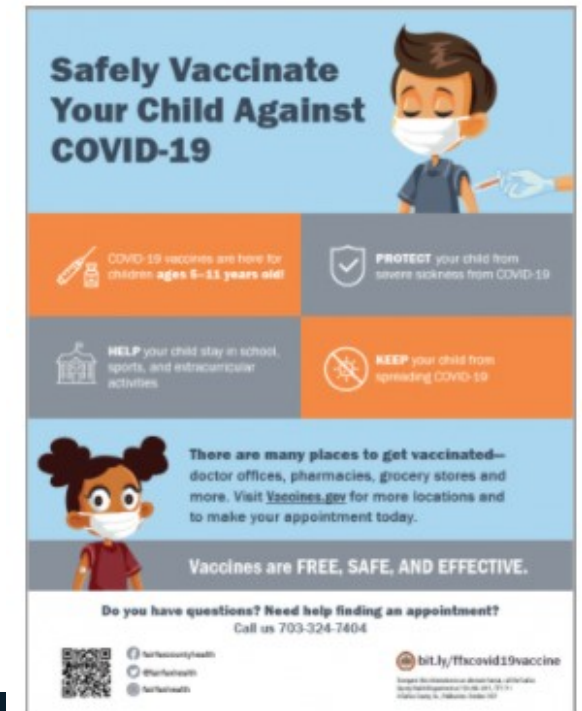
