Each month, a different aspect of equity will be addressed. Focus for December: Implicit Bias

According to Merriam-Webster, implicit bias "is a bias or prejudice that is present but not consciously held or recognized." Implicit bias affects our behaviors, judgement, and decisions. In order to address implicit bias, we must be intentional about identifying our own biases and one way to do this is to take an Implicit Association Test (IAT). This test can help you understand what your implicit biases are and suggest ways for countering them. An example of an IAT is the Harvard Implicit Association Test: <u>Project Implicit (harvard.edu)</u>, This is one way to begin to reduce inequities and barriers as we strive to increase racial and social equity in our community.

The <u>Community Services Board</u> has partnered with the <u>Virginia Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Services</u> to launch **REVIVE!** which trains individuals on what to do and not do in an overdose situation, how to administer naloxone, and what to do afterwards. Each attendee also receives a free REVIVE! kit, which includes all the supplies needed to administer naloxone. The medication itself can be acquired at a pharmacy after completing the training. The Workforce Innovation Skills Hub (WISH)

The WISH is a first of its kind workforce development center and business incubator designed to connect Fairfax County residents with employment that pays a minimum starting salary of \$20 per-hour. The WISH is co-located within the Hybla Valley Community Center, and prioritizes serving residents in adjacent communities who are among the most historically disadvantaged in Fairfax County. The WISH provides training and certifications to those who wish to peruse careers in the skilled trades, healthcare, and technology sectors. It also provides critical wraparound and case management services to ensure that WISH clients have the tools they need to complete their training and break into the middle class.
