Many unaccompanied youth experiencing housing instability lack access to vital documents, such as photo identification, licenses, birth certificates, Social Security cards, and documents needed to get an ID or license. Lack of access to these documents complicates the attempts of youth to meet their basic needs. National Network for Youth has launched <u>I Am Here: ID and Vital Document Legal Hotline for Youth</u>, a free national hotline that provides legal advice, resources, and assistance in obtaining state ID cards and licenses, birth certificates, Social Security cards, and documents needed to get an ID or license.
