V.I.P. is designed to encourage children to develop healthy and positive recreation and enrichment interests, and features a wide variety of recreational activities and services. Camp has a cost of \$50 with some additional costs associated with optional weekly field trips. Children who are residents of Fairfax County or Fairfax City, and will be enrolled in 7th grade or 8th grade in the Fall of 2019 are invited to participate. VIP Camp is designed for middle school age youth with opportunities to attend in five different Fairfax County programs. Individuals are encouraged to register early.

Section 1: Camp Information

I. Sub-camps - Campers must sign up to participate in ONE sub-camp during camp.

Fit Quest subcamp introduces girls & boys to healthy eating, fitness habits, self-confidence and teamwork skills. Activities will include cardio, strength training, as well as nutrition and healthy lifestyle discussions.

Boys Sports Conditioning subcamp is the answer to the aspiring athlete or new athlete's needs. Activities will include 2 mile runs, strength training, agility drills, as well as nutrition and healthy lifestyle discussions. Camp will help prepare students for recreational sports and encourage life –long healthy habits.

Soccer Academy subcamp is for the intermediate to advanced player who loves soccer. Improve your individual and team skills with proven advanced training by a dedicated soccer expert. Guaranteed to improve your skills! Girls and boys welcome.

Theatre subcamp will give campers a chance to explore their dramatic side through character development, presentation methods, and script development and discussion.

Crafts subcamp will give campers a chance to explore the themes of being global citizens through repurposing projects, crafts, and creativity in projects and exploration of their environments.

Volleyball subcamp will give campers a chance to develop and strengthen their volleyball skills. Activities will include drills, strength training, games, as well as nutrition and healthy lifestyle discussions.

II. Mini Program Classes

In addition to attending sub-camp programming, campers will also have the opportunity to take a variety of other special interest classes as part of their daily schedules.

III. Transportation

We are pleased to be able to provide transportation in the morning and afternoon. The bus stops are from the feeder middle schools, as well as some elementary schools. In the afternoon we also have a bus that takes campers to the Mott Community Center for an optional after-care program until 7PM. Exact locations will be provided with the registration packet upon acceptance.

IV. Field Trips

Field Trips: Details and fee information will be released after acceptance has been confirmed. Permission forms will be due at the parent meeting with payment due at the beginning of camp. Commitment to field trips is necessary to determine transportation requirements. Camp will include one field trip each week with the exception of the first week. All field trip attendance is optional.

V. Breakfast/ Lunch

Breakfast is not provided. A hot lunch will be provided on days the campers are at school. On field trip days, campers will either be expected to bring a bagged lunch or bring money to buy lunch at the venue. Campers are strongly encouraged to bring a healthy snack, and water to last them throughout the day.

VI. Camp Registration & Cost

Camp Fees and Forms: There is a \$50 VIP Camp Supply Fee that will be collected from all camp participants. Participants who submit the VIP Camp Application Form will be notified if they have been accepted into camp or placed on a Wait List. Individuals are encouraged to apply early. Students will be placed on a wait list once the program meets its 180-student maximum program capacity.

Accepted participants will receive a confirmation letter/email indicating a date for the mandatory parent meeting during which registration paperwork and fees can be paid, and additional camp information will be provided.

If payment is not received by the parent meeting, participants will forfeit their place in camp and will be replaced by a participant from the Wait List. Please contact the After-School Specialist at your child's school if there are any payment concerns.

Refund Policy: To request a refund of the Camp Supply Fee, contact the After-School Specialist at the VIP Camp Site prior to the cutoff date of Friday, June 14, 2019. Refund requests submitted after the cutoff date will not be considered. Refunds will be in the form of a check. Please allow 3-4 weeks for processing.

VII. Staffing for V.I.P. Summer Teen Programs

VIP camps are staffed by the FCPS After-School Program Specialists (ASPS), Fairfax County Department of Neighborhood and Community Services (NCS) staff, FCPS staff, and other county agencies. This program is sponsored by Fairfax County Public Schools and the County of Fairfax and is staffed by FCPS teachers and staff, County of Fairfax staff, and contractors.
