ROLE OF THE SUPERVISOR'S OFFICE



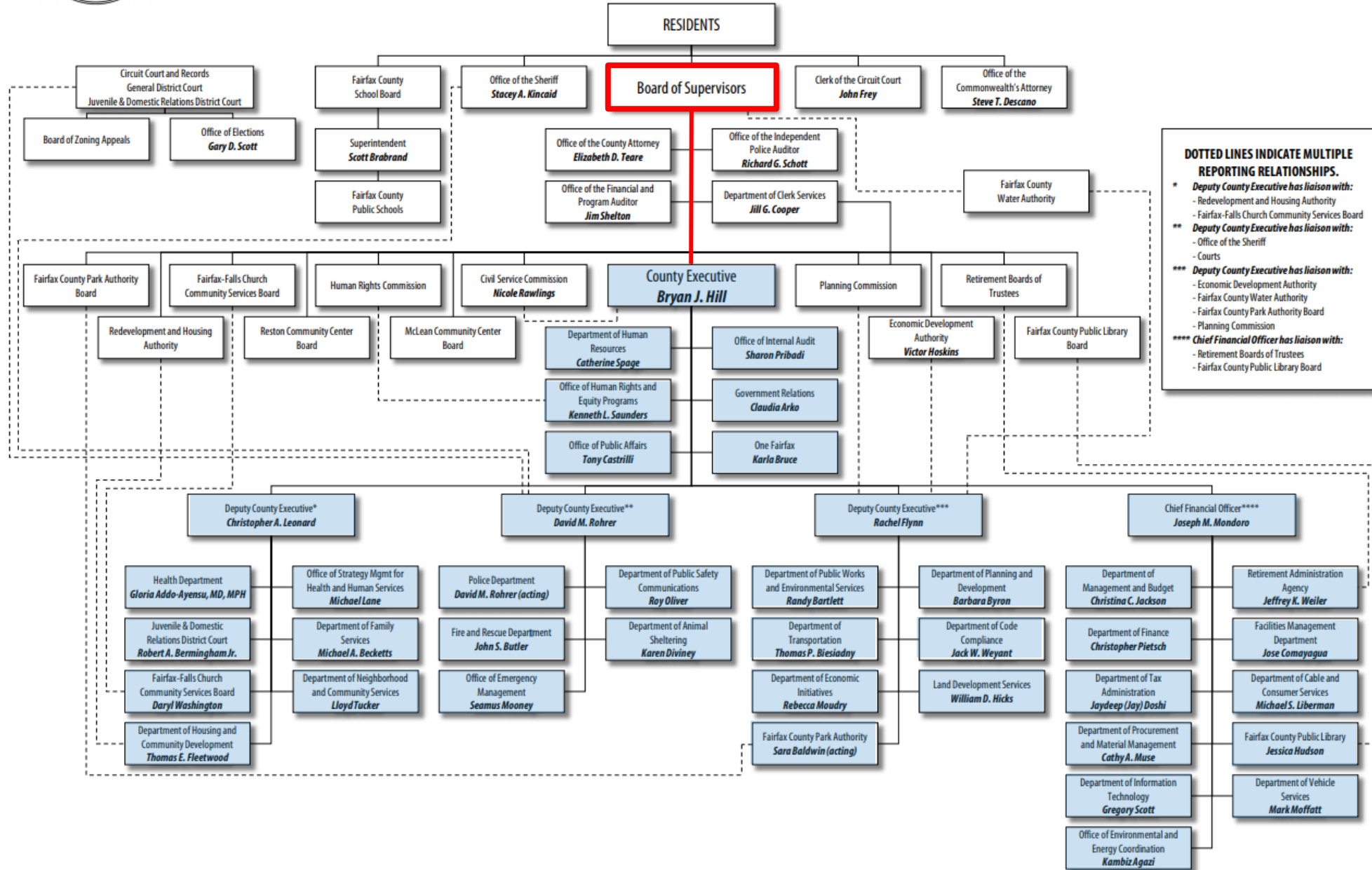
We are an interface between constituents and various County government agencies.

EXAMPLES OF OUR WORK — TRANSPORTATION

- Residential Traffic Administration Program (RTAP)
 - Traffic Calming
 - “Watch for Children” Signs
- Parking programs
 - Community Parking Districts (CPD)
 - Residential Permit Parking District (RPPD)
 - Restricted Parking in commercially zoned areas
 - Work with Police regarding enforcement of all of the programs listed above



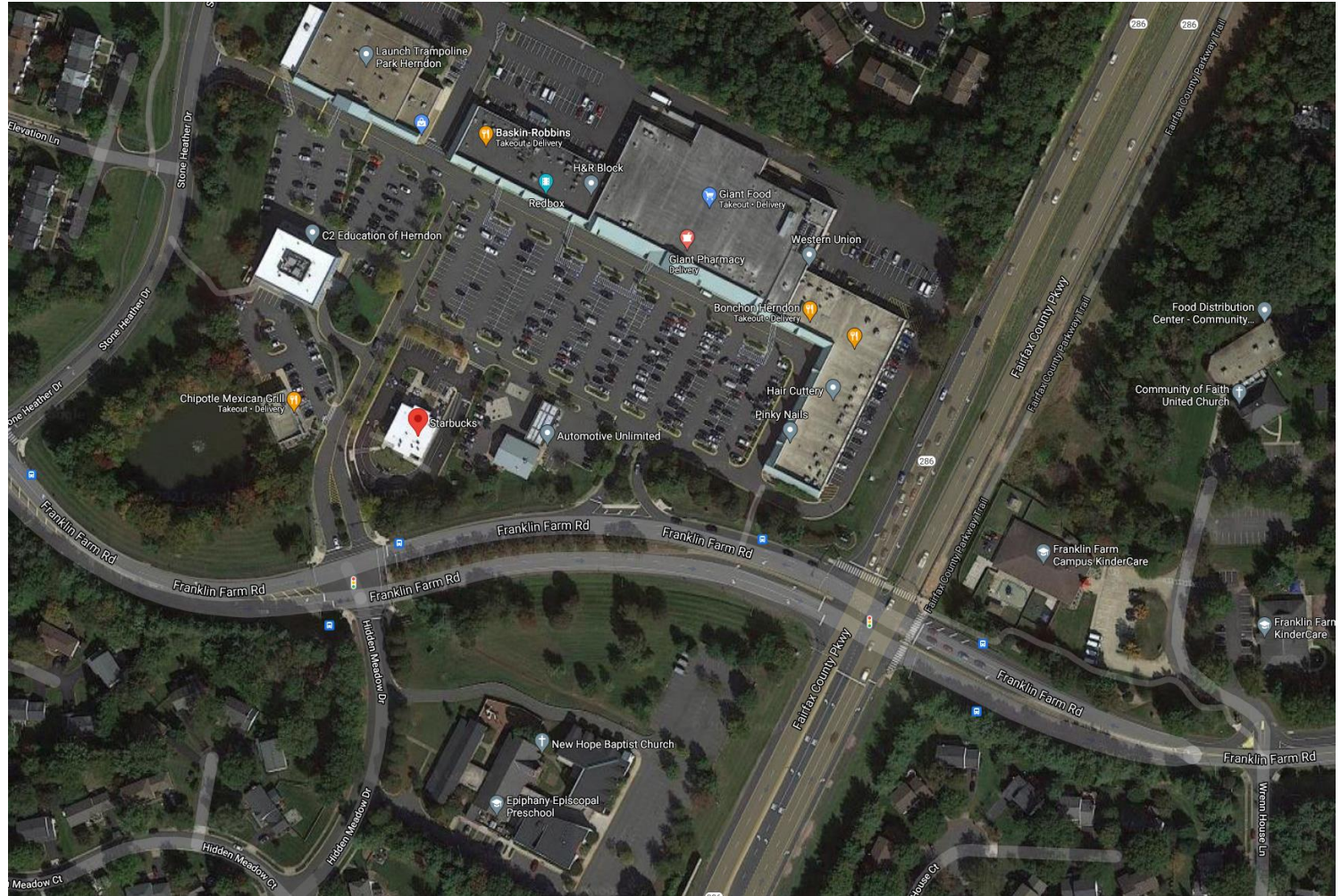
EXAMPLES OF OUR WORK — PROPERTY DEVELOPMENT



- The Rezoning and Special Exception processes allow Fairfax County and property owners to negotiate “proffers” and “development conditions,” respectively.
- Lidl, Costco, and the Penrose Office agreed to a proffer that signaled the Lee Road/Penrose Place intersection, improving traffic flow and reducing the probability of accidents.

EXAMPLES OF OUR WORK — PROPERTY DEVELOPMENT

When the Starbucks at Franklin Farm Shopping Center sought a Special Exception to expand their use within the shopping center, we negotiated development funds for future road improvements.

EXAMPLES OF OUR WORK — SULLY COMMUNITY CENTER



- In November 2016, Fairfax County voters approved the Human Services and Community Development Bond Referendum which provided funding for the construction of the new Sully Community Center - to serve the Chantilly/Centreville/Oak Hill areas.
- With advocacy from Supervisor Smith and in coordination with various agencies, the site will house a health clinic. The site can accommodate future construction of housing for families earning 60 percent of the area median income (AMI).
- Continued advocacy for Connector Bus service
