Using the collective impact approach, the **IMPROVEMENTS IN HOW WE WORK** TOGETHER should, over time, result in noticeable changes in key signs of community well-being related to kindergarten readiness, health, academic success. workforce readiness. inclusion and connectedness, and family stability.
