Opportunity Neighborhoods (ON) is an initiative that brings together residents, service providers, schools, and other supporters in defined communities to create a shared vision to address needs and achieve equitable results for youth and their caregivers.

How does it work?

ON partners work to develop and strengthen our collective impact within and across sites and systems

- Local residents and service providers work together to understand and prioritize community issues, build a movement, create solutions, and hold each other accountable.
- Community issues, root causes, and possible solutions are understood through an **equity** and trauma lens.
- Lead partners use **data** to measure and track progress toward identified goals and address information gaps.
- Partners meet people and communities where they are, build on strengths, and pursue layered, complementary efforts. There's no "one size fits all" approach.
- Partners support and promote existing initiatives in progress, and rely on proven practices when appropriate, to **avoid duplicating efforts** or "reinventing the wheel."
- Mutually beneficial activities that can have strong **impact in multiple areas** are supported and promoted jointly by residents and partners across barriers or silos.
- The **groundwork** of relationship building, collaboration, data development, advocacy, and capacity building is valued and has dedicated funding, staffing, and commitment.
- Residents and partners identify gaps and pursue change at multiple levels: for individuals, for communities, and across systems.

Who is involved?

Each ON site has a lead nonprofit agency that works with community residents and other partners to identify, plan, and work toward goals for youth and families. Partners also work together across sites where similar issues can be addressed in multiple locations, and to connect community voice to broader initiatives that focus on improving the lives and opportunity of children and their caregivers.

What does success look like?

ON partners track community-level data on student population demographics, preschool enrollment, school attendance, academic performance, food security, reported student behavior incidents, and more.

In addition, lead partners track the results of our work, like:

- Percent of resident leaders, partners, and staff reporting increased knowledge and skills from training;
- Number of partners reporting increased capacity to effectively serve the community;
- Percent of local resident participants reporting improved access to opportunity and resources; and
- Number of local teen and adult community leaders involved in planning and partner initiatives.

Where are the ONs? ON is at work in five sites around Fairfax County as of 2022-23.
