7541 Huntsman Blvd, Springfield, VA 22151

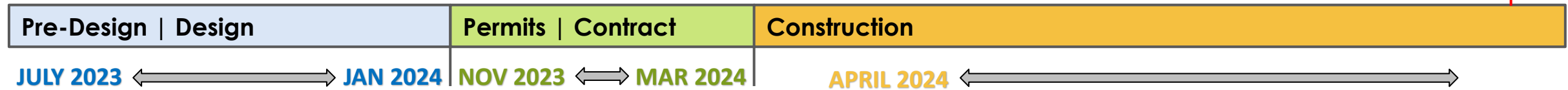
Scope:

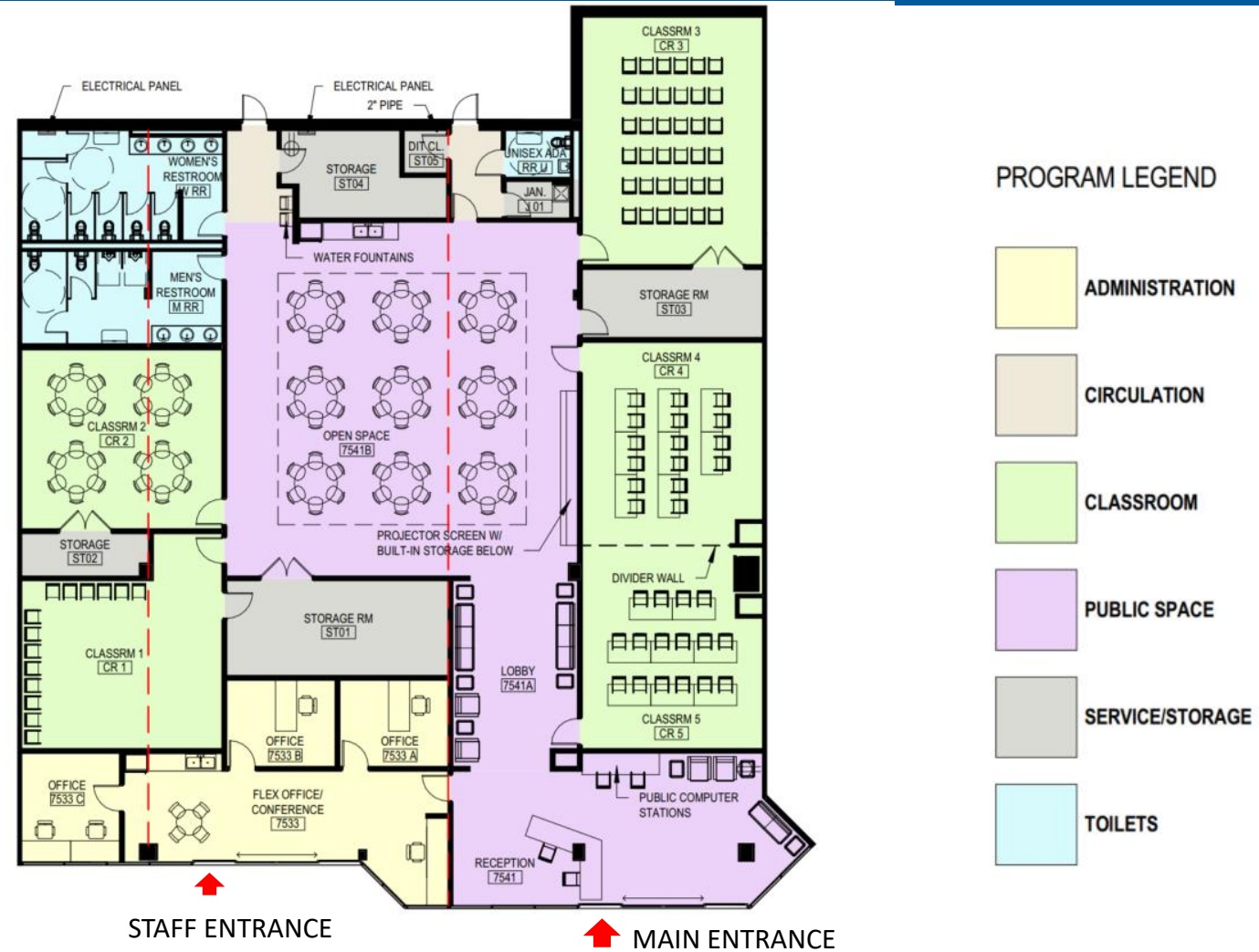

Vision – We envision communities that are inclusive and welcoming of the full diversity of their members of all abilities, in all aspects of community participation.

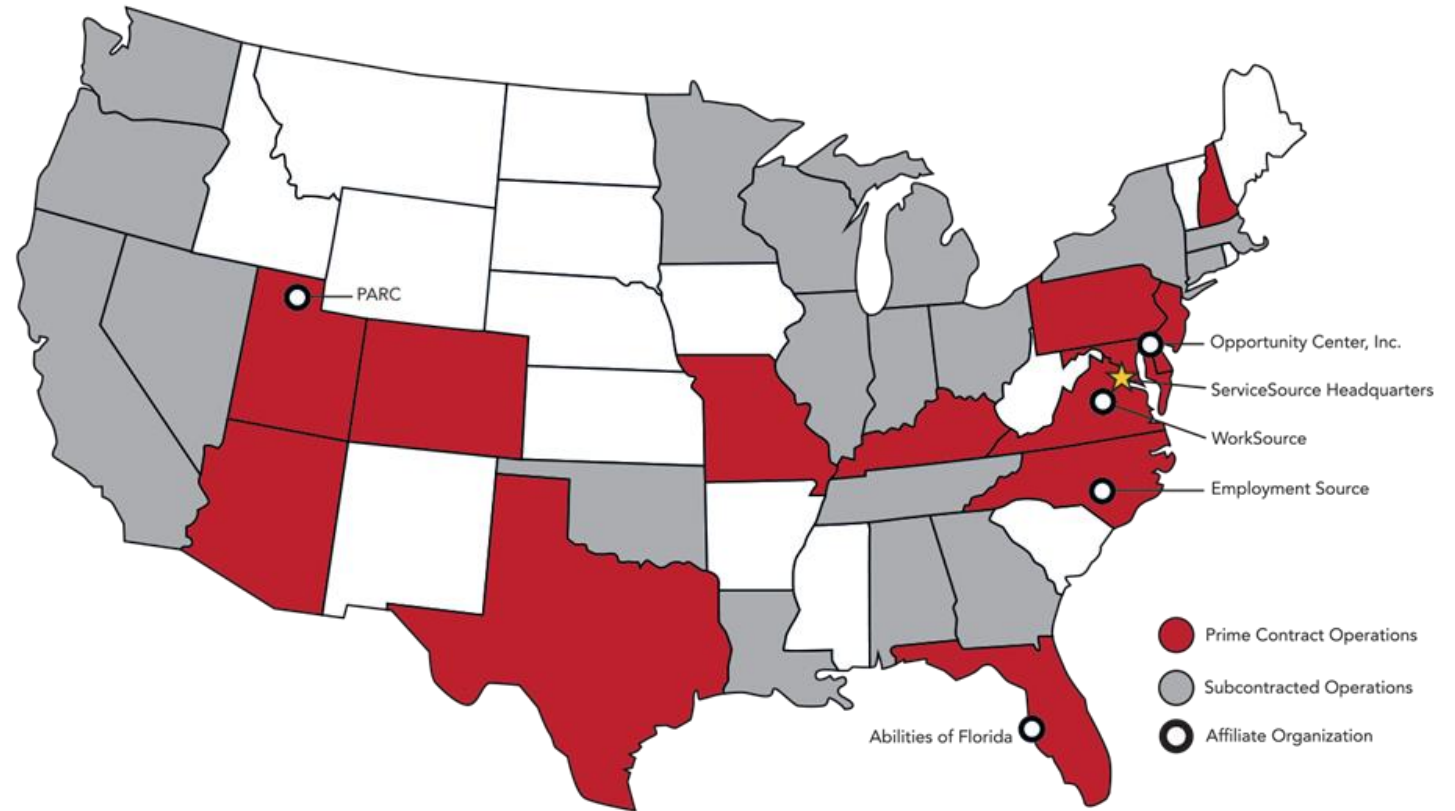
Values - In all that we do, we recognize that we are a bridge to the community. Our values compromise iBridge:



Overview

In FY 2024, ServiceSource:

- Served 35,000+ people with disabilities across all programs
- 2,150+ people with disabilities in direct or facilitated employment
- Placed 1,775+ people with disabilities with third-party employers
- Served 800+ people through long-term community integration services programs

Long-Term and Community Integration Services (LTCIS)

More than 800 individuals with disabilities participate annually in Virginia, North Carolina, Delaware, and Utah

In Virginia:

- Serve 600+ individuals in (soon to be) 14 different programs across Northern Virginia
- Focus on providing person-centered activities in a safe environment.
- Services are tailored to the interests and needs of the individuals.
- Customized, person-centered program options
- Maximize community integration and personal choice

Huntsman Community Integration Program

This program:

- Serves 10 participants and employs 3 staff
- Program Hours: 9 a.m. - 3:30 p.m.
- This program, through person-centered supports, will maximize individual choice and community integration.
- Utilize Service Source vans to transport participants to daily, planned community activities.
