Virtual Mental Wellness Consultations

The Fairfax County Public Schools (FCPS) Office of Intervention and Prevention Services will offer virtual mental wellness consultations this summer from June 21 through August 5. Any Fairfax County parent may request a consultation with a school psychologist or school social worker. Community Partnership Grants

The Office of the Commonwealth's Attorney is inviting Fairfax-based non-profit organizations to apply for <u>Community Partnership Program grants</u> of up to \$10,000. The grants must be used to provide services and programs in support of child victims of crime, victims of sexual abuse, and victims of domestic violence. Such services and programs can include training opportunities for system stakeholders, community relations and outreach activities, and direct support of victims. The deadline for applications is Oct. 1, 2022.
