Construction Begins on Turner Farm Equestrian Parking Area

The Fairfax County Park Authority will begin construction of the equestrian parking at Turner Farm Park, located at 927 Springvale Road, Great Falls, Virginia. Contractor mobilization will begin the week of Oct. 17, 2022. The project scope includes installation of stormwater and drainage features, a new driveway entrance and a gravel parking lot. Weather permitting, we anticipate project completion by the end of December 2022.

On weekdays, work hours will be limited to 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. However, should we encounter unfavorable weather conditions, the contractor may be permitted to work on Saturdays to avoid project delays.

Construction access to the site will be from Springvale Road.

Fear-less Fest Returns to Hidden Oaks Nature Center

One night a year, the forest creatures, and even some plants, come alive at Hidden Oaks Nature Center. Their goal is to explain the misunderstandings many people have about nocturnal creatures and scruffy-looking trees. Families and scout groups have enjoyed hearing the animal side of the story for the last 15 years along the 1/3-mile woodland path by the nature center.

Costumed characters greet all children gently, with no fear factor included, in their brief presentations. Visitors will meet a raccoon, deer, owl and other nature-centric characters, who explain why they have undeserved scary reputations. Participants are invited to come in costume. Children must be accompanied by an adult who is also registered in the class. This guided trail walk and the indoor activities take approximately 75 minutes to complete. Start times are staggered to maximize your experience with each character.

Parking will be at the Packard Center located at 4020 Hummer Road, which is connected to Hidden Oaks by a paved trail. Parking for people with disabilities is available at the nature center.

Lake Accotink Park Hosts Youth Fishing Derby


On Saturday, Oct. 15, 2022, a free Youth Fishing Derby for youngsters ages 15 and below will take place at Lake Accotink Park Marina located at 7500 Accotink Park Road in Springfield, Virginia.

This event promises a morning filled with fun, fishing and prizes. Anglers can check in/register at 9 a.m. Fishing will take place from 9:30 to 11:30 a.m. and prizes will be presented at 11:30 a.m.

For safety, the derby is limited to just 30 participants. Some rods will be available for free at check-in. Worms will be provided, but bring your own rod and tackle if possible. Register early!

Adults can assist any youth in removing fish from hooks and can assist all youth 7 and under with baiting the hook and casting. All fish caught must be brought to the measure site to be counted toward a participant's total and then released immediately.

Prizes will be awarded to the top three winners for total inches caught in both boys' and girls' categories. Age categories include 7 and under, 8 to 11, and 12 to 15. To register visit https://bit.ly/TYOFishing-Derby or scan the QR code below.

McLean Gears Up for Dark Sky Celebration

Dark skies are the natural state of nature. Over time, humans have increased the amount of light shining into the sky all night long. This excessive light has robbed us of the glimpse of our stars and endangered the natural world around us. We can have dark skies again if we learn to control light pollution with responsible outdoor lighting practices.

The Fairfax County Park Authority is partnering with the McLean Citizens Association, Dark Sky Friends and the Analemma Society to host a celebration of the importance of dark skies.

Come to the historic house in Lewinsville Park on Saturday, Nov. 12, 2022 to learn about the importance of dark skies in your community. The free event will have hands-on activities and educational opportunities about how to protect the night sky. Learn about night time wildlife and constellations. Come experience the night with us and enjoy a small campfire and cocoa. The event runs from 6:30 until 8:30 p.m.

There is no cost to the "Dark Sky Celebration" program, and registration is not required but is encouraged. You can register through Parktakes online at www.fairfaxcounty.gov/parks/parktakes. By signing up, we can notify you in case of inclement weather. The rain date is the following day on Sunday, Nov. 13, 2022.

Join the Fun and Celebrate Harvest Time at Colvin Run Mill

Just in case you have not signed up yet, you can still spend a day in the 1800s and explore how local crops were turned into food. Once the farmers harvested their crops, they sold their grain to the miller.

You can run the sheller and help remove the corn from the cobs. Then, watch as the 20-foot water wheel powers the historic Colvin Run Mill, grinding corn into grits and cornmeal. See the Colvin Run still and learn how corn was also made into whiskey. Sample a muffin made from Colvin Run Mill grains and taste fresh cider. Play historic games and make a toy from corn husks. Visit the Miller's House and shop in the General Store. This is a terrific, family-friendly event, perfect on a fall afternoon.

Harvest Day is Saturday, Oct. 22, 2022, from noon until 3 p.m. at Colvin Run Mill Historic Site. The fee is \$10 per person and is open to participants ages 4 and above. Register through Parktakes online at www.fairfaxcounty.gov/parks/parktakes.
