Hidden Oaks Nature Center Recognized for Educational Videos

As the pandemic canceled field trips and access to nature centers, Fairfax County Park Authority staff members looked for creative ways to fill that educational gap. One way was to go virtual in support of the Virginia standards of learning in science.

Hidden Oaks Nature Center took that challenge to heart, developing a video alternative to onsite field trips. That effort was recently recognized with a third-place win in the pandemic pivot category by the 2022 NAI (National Association for Interpretation) Interpretive Media Awards. The National Association for Interpretation is a nonprofit professional association of natural and cultural resources interpreters, primarily in the United States.

Visitor Services Manager Suzanne Holland and naturalist Alex Doumbia played key roles in this endeavor. With the financial support of the Northrop Grumman Corporation and the Fairfax County Park Foundation, plus the advice of Fairfax County Public School elementary school science curriculum coordinator Jill Curry, the staff created 15 short videos of mini field trips and posted them on YouTube for county students and the public to get a virtual experience. The videos, each running between four to seven minutes, highlighted topics in the K-7 curriculum.

Two were created in Spanish, featuring naturalists Cesia Lobo and Alex Doumbia. The videos showcased live native animals, local outdoor nature venues in parks, and a diverse set of instructors who connected the students to the message in an engaging, mock field trip format.

With easy access to short clips at no cost to the school, teacher or parent, this online resource provided local experiences that students could relate to and visit at an area park with their parents. Some experiences were exactly like an in-person field trip -- from tagging a monarch butterfly to stream monitoring for aquatic insects -- these videos enabled tens of thousands of students to benefit from local nature experiences and supported meaningful connections with their virtual learning.

For over a decade Northrop Grumman Corporation and Fairfax County Park Foundation have supported direct experience watershed education through a grant to Hidden Oaks Nature Center. This grant enables over 1,000 seventh graders and 600 fourth graders from Title 1 schools to attend fields trips to the nature center.

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New Survey Will Help Develop Park Planning Strategy

Add your voice to the conversation via a short survey. The Fairfax County Park Authority (FCPA) is developing a Parks, Recreation, Open Space, and Access Strategy known as PROSA. The PROSA Strategy will provide a framework for equitable access to the park system and will be completed in 2023. Park officials believe the new plan will provide a pathway toward improved park access and a balance of recreational experiences

Community input is key to this process. The public is invited to participate in the community survey and help shape the future of our local park system. The survey can be completed online at <u>https://publicin-put.com/PROSA</u>. The survey should take no more than 10 minutes to complete and is available in English, Spanish, Korean and Vietnamese languages. The survey runs until Dec. 11, 2022.

The program is appropriate for those 16 years and older, and the cost is \$42 per person (plus \$35 supply fee).
