### ACTION

### <u>Riverbend Park – Mastenbrook Volunteer Matching Fund Grant Program Request –</u> <u>Friends of Riverbend Park (Dranesville District)</u>

### ISSUE:

Approval of a Mastenbrook Volunteer Matching Fund Grant Program request from the Friends of Riverbend Park in the amount of \$3,000 to replace the canoes at Riverbend Park.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

The Park Authority Executive Director recommends approval of the Mastenbrook Volunteer Matching Fund Grant Program request from the Friends of Riverbend Park in the amount of \$3,000 to replace the canoes at Riverbend Park.

### TIMING:

Board action is requested on July 25, 2018, in order to award the grant.

### BACKGROUND:

The Friends of Riverbend Park (FORB) have proposed replacing the ten canoes at Riverbend Park (Attachment 1). The existing canoes were purchased in 2010, have received over 3,000 uses, served a great many camps and programs, and produced over \$56,000 in revenue. Given the age of the canoes and how much use they have received over the years, the canoes are becoming worn and are in poor condition. The new canoes have been approved by staff and will be similar to the old ones in color and style.

The cost of the purchase is being shared between FORB and the Park Authority, with FORB requesting \$3,000 from the Mastenbrook Volunteer Matching Fund Grants Program to match against their contribution toward the purchase (Attachment 2). If approved, the \$3,000 from the Mastenbrook Volunteer Matching Fund Grants Program, along with a \$3,000 contribution from the FORB and \$454 from the Park Authority, will provide the funds sufficient to complete the purchase. The total purchase cost is \$6,454.

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FORB has been a valuable partner of Riverbend Park for almost two decades. Over the years, FORB has contributed approximately a quarter of a million dollars of support funds towards many projects and programs.

The Park Authority Board Member for the Dranesville District supports approval of the Grant request. Staff from Riverbend Park will manage the purchase, which is scheduled to be completed during the fall of 2018. Matching funds are available to complete this project.

#### FISCAL IMPACT:

The estimated total project cost is \$6,454. Funds are currently available in the amount of \$3,000 in WBS PR-000078, Park Renovations and Upgrades - 2016, in Fund 300-C30040, Park Bond Construction Fund; and \$3,000 from FORB; and \$454 in Cost Center P515107009, Riverbend, in Fund 800-C80000; resulting in the total available funding of \$6,454. Operational expenses will be managed using existing operational resources.

Contingent on the approval of this project, the remaining balance in the Mastenbrook Volunteer Matching Fund Grant Program will be \$241,290.19.



### 2. Project

Title: Riverbend Park Canoe Replacement Project

### 4. Project Description

At present, Riverbend Park has 10 canoes which were initially provided to the park by the Friends of Riverbend Park in 2010 through a grant from L.L. Bean. Those canoes have provided many years (7 seasons) of enjoyment for park visitors and have provided substantial revenue for the park through half-day and full-day rentals. Since they were first placed in service for the 2011 season through the present day, these 10 canoes have been rented over 3000 times yielding a total of revenue of over \$56,000. In addition, each canoe has seen 50 or more uses annually for camps, fishing programs and scout merit badge programs at Riverbend Park. There is no question that these canoes are a valuable asset to Riverbend Park.

However, these canoes are aging, due both to the length and intensity of their service, and need to be replaced. The Friends of Riverbend Park (FORB) proposes to replace all ten of these canoes from its own assets and with the aid of a matching Mastenbrook grant from the Fairfax County Park Authority. The staff at Riverbend Park has already identified an appropriate supplier (Confluence Outdoor) and obtained a cost estimate of \$6,454.00 for ten new canoes.

### 5. Public Benefits

The cances at Riverbend Park provide opportunities for outdoor recreation in a natural environment and enhanced quality of life through hands-on experiences. The boat rental operation at Riverbend serves all visitors with opportunities to explore the shorelines of the park and the Potomac River, and to observe first hand wildlife in its natural environment. The cances are also an exceptional asset providing quality educational and recreational experiences through their use in the park's programs, camps and tours.

Canoes are in high demand by park visitors. Existing canoes have been used 600 to 700 times, but are now reaching the end of their useful lifespan. Support for this project will allow Riverbend Park to replace its old fleet and provide new canoes for the public to enjoy. Without replacement, the current fleet will need to be removed from service by the end of the 2019 season, and will not be available in FY20.

#### 6. Sponsor Commitment

What experience do you or the organization have in accomplishing similar projects? Who will be responsible for organizing and assigning the work to insure successful project completion? Since its founding in 1999, FORB has provided approximately \$250,000 in support for many different projects and programs at Riverbend Park. Included have been over \$100,000 to support the summer camp interns, over \$20,000 to support the Indian Festival in its early years before it became fully self-supporting, \$15,000 for a Bass Fishing Boat in 2015, and over \$15,000 for equipment and supplies for many projects over the past 20 years. FORB has also applied for and been awarded Mastenbrook grants in 2010 and 2013.

Hugh Morrow, FORB President, and John Callow, Riverbend Park Manager, will work together to obtain the necessary quotes and documentation for procuring the canoes. FORB will pay for the canoes, but will require the matching Mastenbrook grant as soon as the canoes are delivered. Long-term maintenance of the canoes will be the responsibility of the Riverbend Park staff who are experienced in doing so.
