
## MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. PARK – PLAYGROUND REPLACEMENT

### OAK MARR RECENTER – AOP REPLACEMENT OF UV WATER TREATMENT

- This project installed a Hydroxyl-Based Advanced Oxidation (AOP) treatment system that replaces the need for an Ultra-Violet (UV) unit for pool water treatment. The AOP system consumes only 10% of the electricity needed for UV and will help reduce the pool chemicals needed.
- The project was implemented with Energy Funds at the County FY2021 Carryover Budget.





## SULLY HIGHLANDS PARK—AUTOMATED CONTROLS FOR HEATERS & FANS

- The project installed two JENEsys controllers with associated temperature sensors for Sully Highlands Park to control pumphouse, restrooms, and concession stand heaters and fans. The controllers can be se tup by the park staff, using an established passcode and are capable for remote cellular/web-based access and scheduling functions in the future. The restrooms exhaust fan is also functioning by occupation sensors.
