CAPRA Accreditation Update

In June 2023 the Park Authority will participate in the reaccreditation review by visitors from the Commission of Parks and Recreation Accreditation (CAPRA). The Park Authority was first accredited in October 2008 and reaccredited in 2013 and 2018. A reaccreditation visit is required every five years to review the Authority's evidence of compliance as it relates to the 154 standards.

At this meeting, staff will share information on the timeline for CAPRA Accreditation, the Park Authority Board's role in accreditation and information on the CAPRA Review Team virtual visit process.

What is Agency Accreditation?

Agency Accreditation is a process of appraisal whereby park and recreation agencies of all types and sizes can demonstrate that they meet the requirements (standards) to provide ongoing quality programs, services, and facilities to their residents.



Who is CAPRA?

The Commission of Accreditation of Park and Recreation Agencies is a 15-member board composed of representatives from:

- National Recreation Park Association (NRPA)
- American Academy for Park and Recreation Administration (AAPRA)
- International City/County Management Association (ICMA)
- Council of State Executive Directors (CSED)
- The Academy of Leisure Sciences (TALS)
- National Association of County Park and Recreation Officials (NACPRO)
- Armed Forces Recreation Network (AFRN)

Example Standard

7.1 – Parkland Acquisition Procedures



Standard: The agency shall have established policies and procedures for the acquisition of lands for park, recreation, conservation, and historical-cultural purposes that are backed by legal authority and periodically reviewed. This authority usually originates in state enabling acts, is delegated to local governments and is implemented through local charters and ordinances.

Suggested Evidence of Compliance: Provide policy and procedures for land acquisition, the citation of legal authority to acquire lands, and last review.



Reaccreditation Process

- Submit annual reports
- Apply for reaccreditation (every 5 years)
- Gather evidence of compliance & complete self assessment (Submitted on March 31st)
- CAPRA initial review
- CAPRA visit team assesses evidence
- Visits FCPA <u>virtually</u> (June 12-16)
- Commission reviews visit report
- Accreditation Hearing October 2023

Reaccreditation

- 154 standards 10 major categories
- 100% of the 36 fundamental standards must be achieved - <u>Met</u>
- 95% (112 of remaining 118) of nonfundamental standards must be <u>Met</u>
- Met or Unmet
- FCPA SUBMITTED <u>967</u> DOCUMENTS AS EVIDENCE





Why is Accreditation Valuable?

- Accredited agencies report statistically significant higher staff motivation
- Provides groundwork for regular review of operations, policies and procedures and promotes continual improvement
- Provides an assurance to the public that we are meeting national standards of best practice
- Fosters a sense of teamwork and pride among staff



What has changed?

- The Standards were updated in 2019
 - 3 new standards added
 - 4 existing standards were revised
- NRPA created an online portal to submit narratives and links to evidence documentation
- Reaccrediting agency visits are all-virtual
- Visitation team will do the majority of the review prior to the week of the virtual visit



FCPA Visit

- Scheduled for June 12 16, 2023
 - Preliminary meetings with visit team to determine schedule
 - Meetings during visit week to review documentation, answer follow-up questions, share videos to showcase Park Authority sites and programs
 - End of week meetings to conclude visit
- Three person visit team
