#### ACTION

<u>Pine Ridge Park</u> – <u>Mastenbrook Volunteer Matching Fund Grant Program Request</u> – <u>Braddock Road Youth Club (Mason District)</u>

#### ISSUE:

Approval of a Mastenbrook Volunteer Matching Fund Grant request from the Braddock Road Youth Club in the amount of \$6,205 to help fund a project to extend the fencing around field 6 at Pine Ridge Park.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

The Park Authority Executive Director recommends approval of a Mastenbrook grant award in the amount of \$6,205 to help fund a project to extend the fencing around field 6 at Pine Ridge Park.

#### TIMING:

Board action is requested on June 5, 2024, in order to award the grant.

#### BACKGROUND:

Braddock Road Youth Club (BRYC) is proposing to extend the fencing around field 6 at Pine Ridge Park (Attachment 1.) If approved, the new fencing will connect the existing fencing, resulting in the field being fully enclosed. This measure has become necessary due to ongoing interference from spectators and unauthorized players which at times has prevented authorized user groups from fully accessing their field time.

Three sections of fencing are proposed to be added along the southwest corner, midsection of the field's southern edge, and at the southeast corner. Each section will include a maintenance access gate. The proposed fencing will achieve the Park Authority's preferred standard for fencing around athletic fields. The work will be undertaken using an approved County contractor.

To help fund the project, BRYC is requesting a Mastenbrook grant of \$6,205 (Attachment 2.) If approved, the grant will be matched by a \$6,205 cash donation from BRYC. Together, these two sources will provide sufficient funds to complete the project, which has a total budget of \$12,410. Inspections and maintenance of the fencing will be managed through existing resources.

Currently holding Adopt-A-Field agreements for Winterset Varsity and Howrey Parks, BRYC has contributed significant funds over the years towards maintenance and multiple athletic field improvement projects at both of those parks as well as Pine Ridge Park, Wakefield Park, and Lake Braddock SS. The Park Authority Board Member for the Mason District supports approval of the grant request. Staff from the Park Operations Division will manage the project, which is scheduled to be completed in the Fall of 2024.

#### FISCAL IMPACT:

The estimated total project cost is \$12,410. Funds are currently available in the amount of \$6,205 in PR-000147, Park Renovations and Upgrades-2020, in Fund 300-C30400, Park Bond Construction Fund; and \$6,205 in funds that BRYC will contribute, resulting in total anticipated funding of \$12,410.

Contingent on approval of this grant, the balance in the Mastenbrook Volunteer Matching Funds Grant Program will be \$597,910.



An additional \$900.00 is required to mark utilities. We offer to contribute half the funds needed for FCPA to complete the project.




