SUPER SHRUBS & TINY TREES		\$17	
<p>2 Silky Dogwood (<i>Cornus amomum</i>) 6-12' tall. Full to part sun. Moist to wet soils.</p> <p>Beautiful white clustered flowers May-June and orange, red, or purple fall color. High wildlife value for birds and small mammals. Perfect for areas near wetlands or streambanks.</p>	<p>2 Common Buttonbush (<i>Cephalanthus occidentalis</i>) 6-12' tall. Full sun to full shade. Moist to flooded soils.</p> <p>Produces fragrant creamy white flowers July-Aug. and interesting fruit in the fall. Grows well in wetlands and along lake and pond edges. Tolerates drought and flooding to 36". Used by butterflies and other beneficial insects.</p>	<p>2 American Hazelnut (<i>Corylus americana</i>) 10-15' tall. Partial sun. Dry to moist soils.</p> <p>Edible light brown nuts Aug.-Sep. and turns yellow-orange in the fall. Wildlife value for songbirds, small mammals, and butterflies. Forms large thicket along forest edges, hillsides, fence rows, and floodplain forests.</p>	<p>2 Eastern Redbud (<i>Cercis canadensis</i>) 20-35' tall. Part to full shade. Dry to moist soils.</p> <p>Pink to lavender flowers Apr.-May and turns a golden yellow in the fall. Commonly found along streambanks. Fixes nitrogen.</p>

SPACE SAVERS & BOUNTIFUL BERRIES		\$17	
<p>2 New Jersey Tea (<i>Ceanothus americanus</i>) 3' tall. Full to part sun. Dry soils.</p> <p>Clusters of white flowers May-Sept. and yellow to tan fall color. Does well in meadows and other dry open areas. Fixes nitrogen.</p>	<p>2 Spicebush (<i>Lindera benzoin</i>) 6.5-16' tall. Partial to full shade. Wet to moist soils.</p> <p>Yellow flowers Mar-May, edible red berries Sep-Oct. Yellow fall foliage. High wildlife value for songbirds, small mammals, and butterflies. Performs well in loamy to sandy soil on shaded wooded slopes, and floodplain forests.</p>	<p>2 Aromatic Sumac (<i>Rhus aromatica</i>) 6' tall. Full to part sun. Dry soils.</p> <p>Fuzzy edible wine-red berry clusters July-Mar. and aromatic leaves. Red fall foliage. High wildlife value for songbirds, small mammals, and beneficial insects. Performs well in rocky areas and slopes.</p>	<p>2 Beautyberry (<i>Callicarpa americana</i>) 6' tall. Full to partial sun. Dry to moist soils.</p> <p>Lavender-pink flowers June-Aug. and lavender berries Sept.-Mar. Can be easily pruned if overgrown to 18" and will regrow in a season. Found in woods and moist thickets.</p>
