Made possible by Community Foundation for Northern Virginia support, the National Park Service and the Fairfax County Park Foundation, the Wonder Wagon is on a mission to offer 150 programs annually and serve more than 3,500 community members. This initiative not only supplements Virginia's Science standards of learning, and the Park Authority's mission, but it also aligns with countywide initiatives and goals.
